ALOHA, ISLANDERS! We hope you had an amazing time at *Mystery Island*, tracking down the one true God! Today at Chameleon Cave, you learned that there is only one God—the God of the Bible. Our animal pal, Camo the chameleon, is always changing colors, but the God of the Bible doesn't change. He was and is and always will be the same.

From the Bible (Acts 17), you learned that everywhere Paul looked in Athens (Greece), he saw idols—false gods people created with their own hands. The people there worshipped false idols instead of the one true God. The Greeks even worshipped an unknown god, but Paul told the people about the one true God. God can be known! God doesn't live in temples made by man, and he isn't a statue made of silver and gold. He is the Creator of the world! When we seek the one true God, we will find that he wants to have a relationship with us. God sent his Son, Jesus, who lived and died and was raised from the dead to pay the penalty for our sins. We can have a relationship with him when we turn from our sins and believe in Jesus. We not only get to know about God, but we also have the opportunity to *know* God.

God is GREAT! He is the one and only God, the awe-inspiring Creator.



DAY 2: GOD IS ALMIGHTY

WELCOME BACK, ISLANDERS! Today at *Mystery Island*, you traveled to Octopus Inlet where you learned about three big words, all starting with omni: omniscient (God is all knowing), omnipotent (God is all powerful), and omnipresent (God is all present).

The Bible is full of accounts that show how God knows everything, has all power, and is everywhere. One of those accounts is about a man named Jonah. Jonah was a prophet, someone who speaks for God. God came to Jonah and told him to go to a place called Nineveh to tell the people there about God. Nineveh was a nasty place, and Jonah did not want to go. So, Jonah tried to run away from God, but you can't run away from him because God is everywhere. Jonah got on a boat and headed out to sea. Because Jonah disobeyed, God sent a big storm. (God is omnipotent—he even has power over storms.) To make the storm stop, Jonah was thrown overboard. The storm stopped and God sent a big fish to swallow Jonah. God knew exactly what was going to happen. (He is omniscient.) Even in the belly of a fish, Jonah couldn't escape from God. (He is omnipresent.)

Flip the flapjack octopus reminds us that, like Jonah, we can think we are hiding, but there is nowhere we can go that God is not. Nothing is hidden from God, not even a flapjack octopus, down in the deep, dark ocean. God is everywhere, all the time. He knows everything and how everything works, and he has power over animals, sickness, nature, and all things.

God is ALMIGHTY! He is all knowing, all powerful, and all present!




HELLO, ISLANDERS! In Jellyfish Lagoon today, you discovered that God is not just loving—God is love! Because God loves us, he wants to have a relationship with each of us so we can know him and live with him in heaven someday.

From the Bible, we learn that we all sin (Romans 3:23). And the punishment for sin is death (Romans 6:23) and eternal separation from God's goodness. Because we sin, we cannot go to be with God in heaven on our own when we die. God is holy and perfect, and he can't allow even one sin in heaven. But God loves us so much, and he provided a way to rescue us from our sins about 2,000 years ago.

God the Son came to earth in the form of a baby. This baby was Jesus. The word "Emmanuel" means "God with us," because God was with us on earth! Jesus came to earth as a baby, lived a perfect life, and then willingly died on the cross to take the punishment for sin that we deserved. Then he rose from the dead! God sent his Son so we can know him and be saved from our sins. To become part of God's family, you have to believe that Jesus is God and that he took the punishment for your sin. Once you are part of God's family, you will forever receive him into your life and be part of his family for all eternity.

Jam the immortal jellyfish reminds us that we can live with God forever someday if we admit, believe, and forever receive the Lord.

God is EMMANUEL! He is the loving, good Savior who came to earth.
