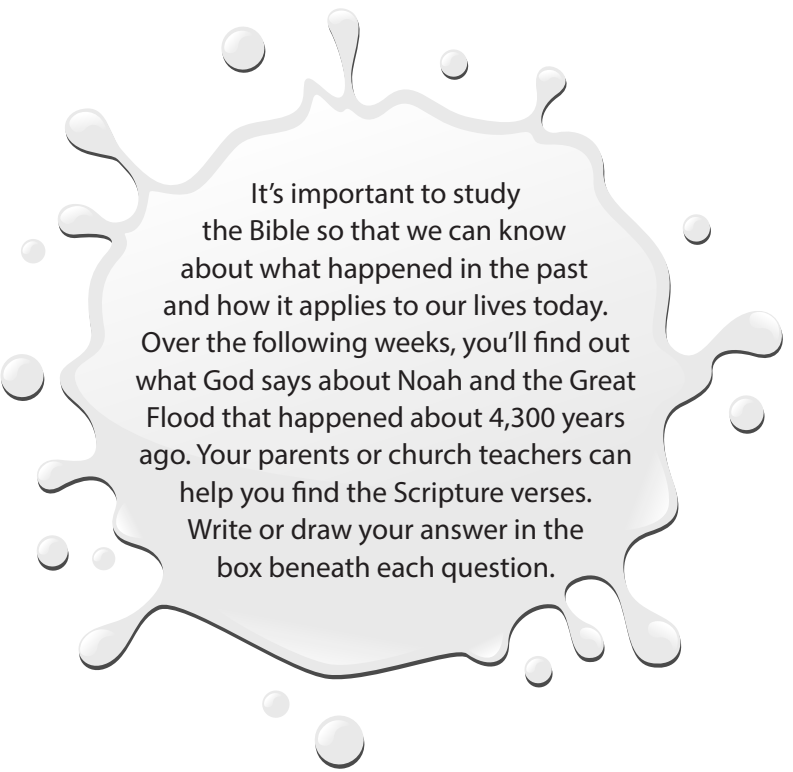




DIVING into **GOD'S WORD**

WEEK 1

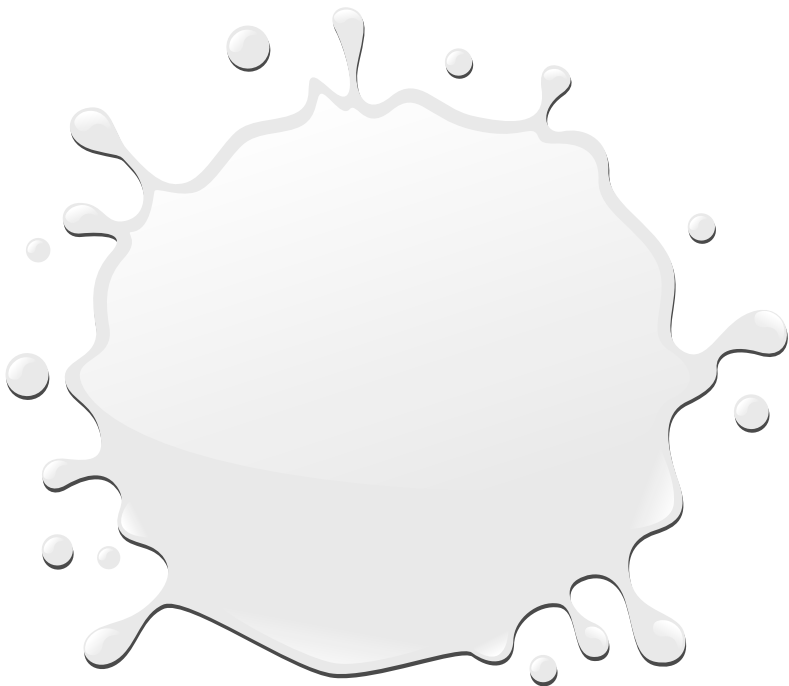
Noah

Q. What did the Lord give Noah?

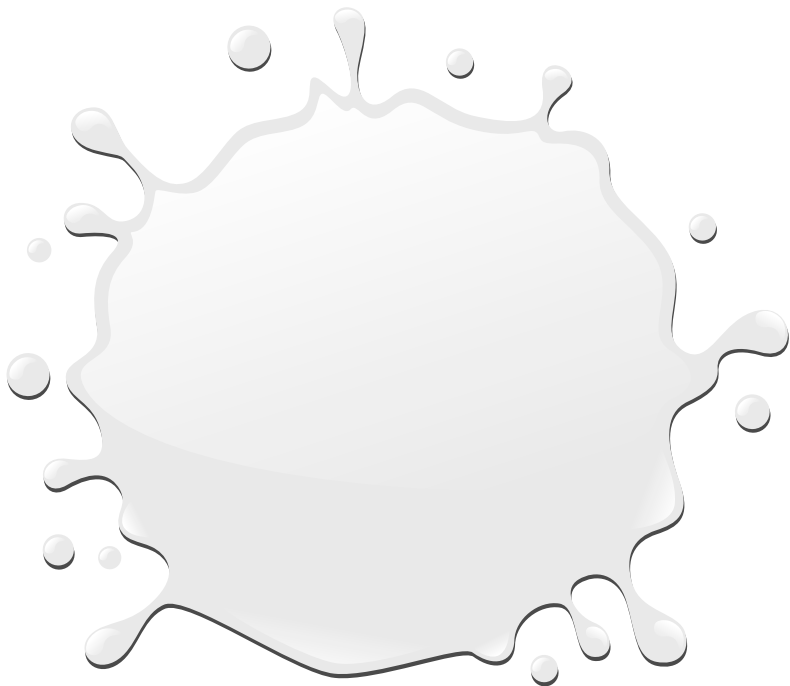
Genesis 6:8

Genesis 6:9

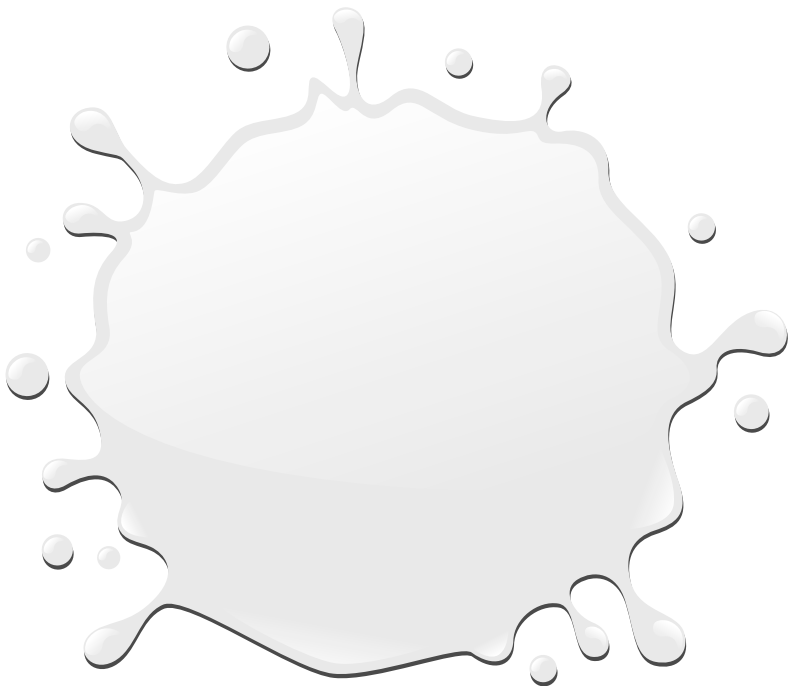


A. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation. Noah walked with God.

Genesis 6:5, 11–12

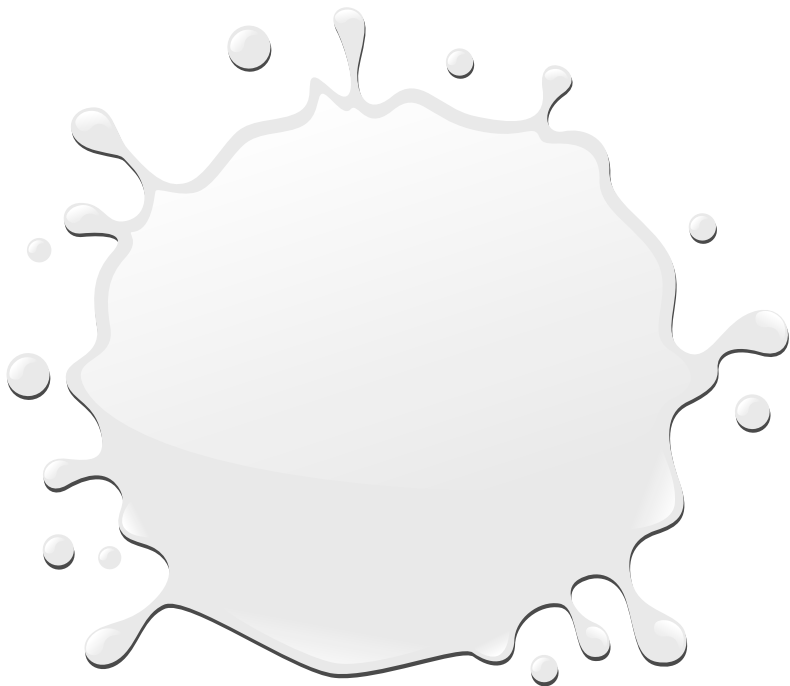


A. The wickedness of the people was great and every intention of the heart was evil.

Hebrews 11:7

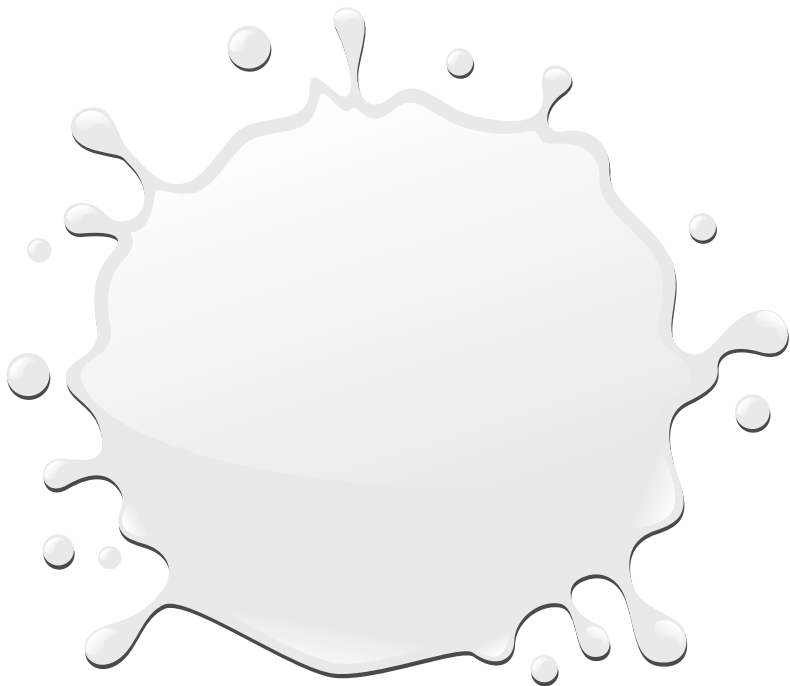
A. He had faith in God and obeyed what God commanded.

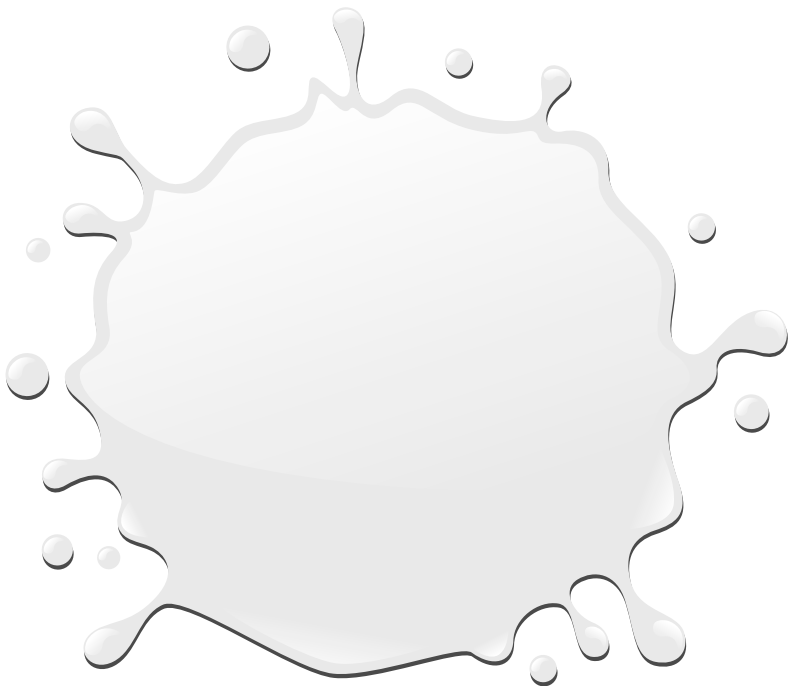
The Flood

Q. Why did God send a flood during Noah's time?

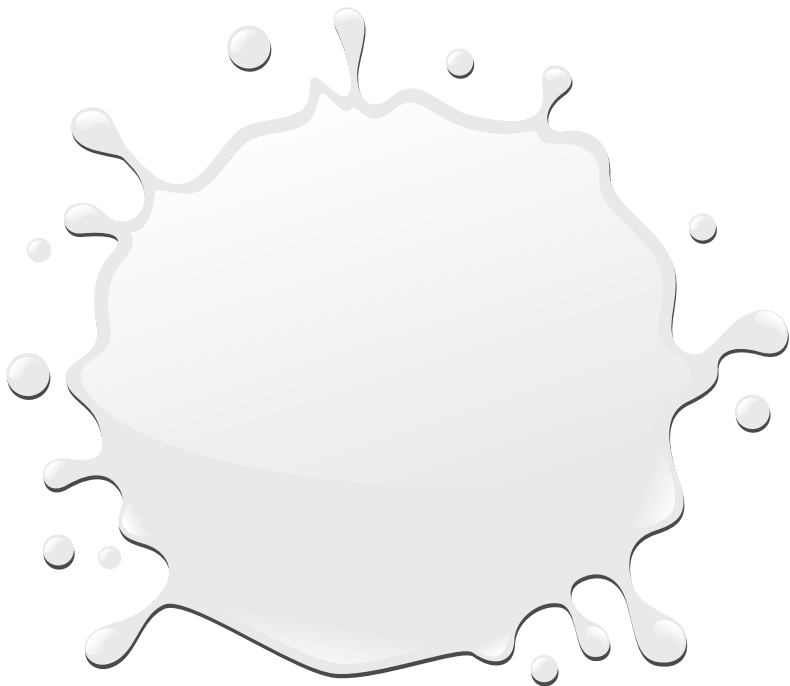
Genesis 6:11–17

Genesis 7:13–21

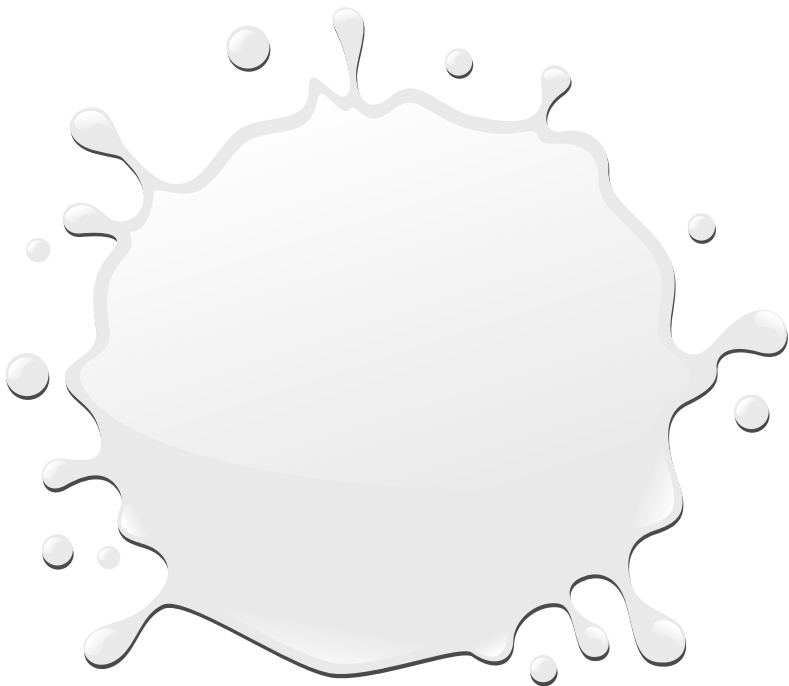


A. The flood covered the whole earth. All the high hills were covered.

Q. What happened to all the land animals and people who weren't on the Ark?

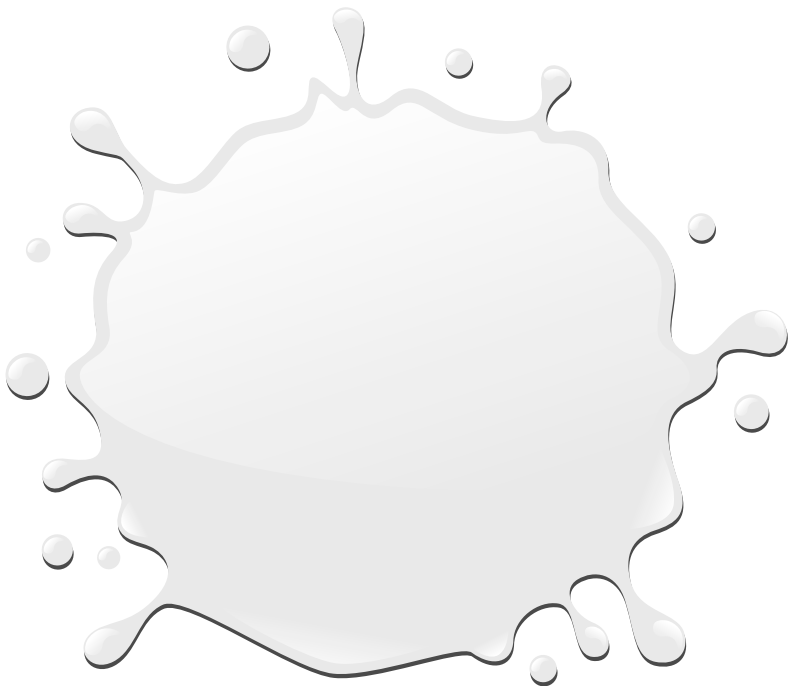
Genesis 7:18–23



A. All land-dwelling, air-breathing creatures (including people) that weren't on the Ark drowned in the waters of the Flood.

Genesis 7:23

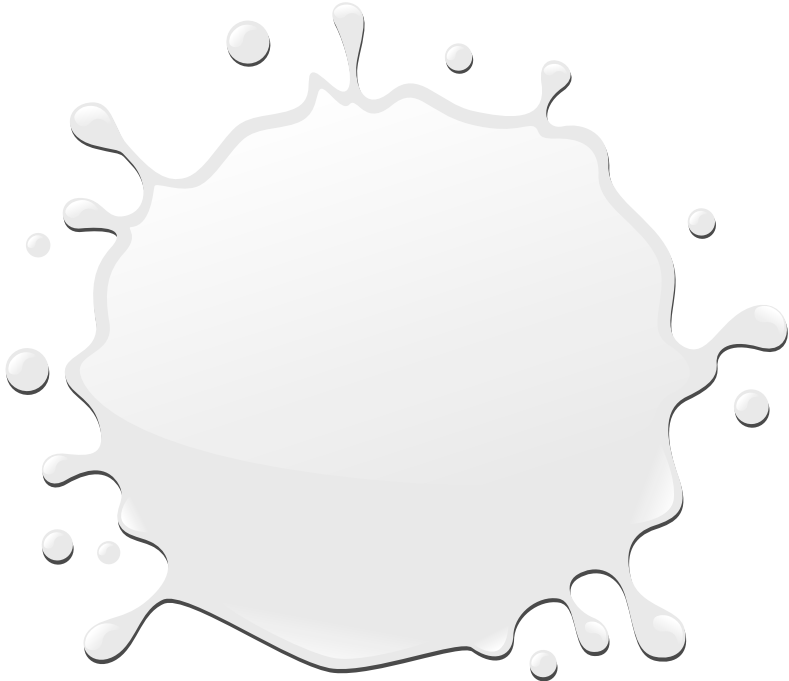


A. God saved Noah and those with him on the Ark.

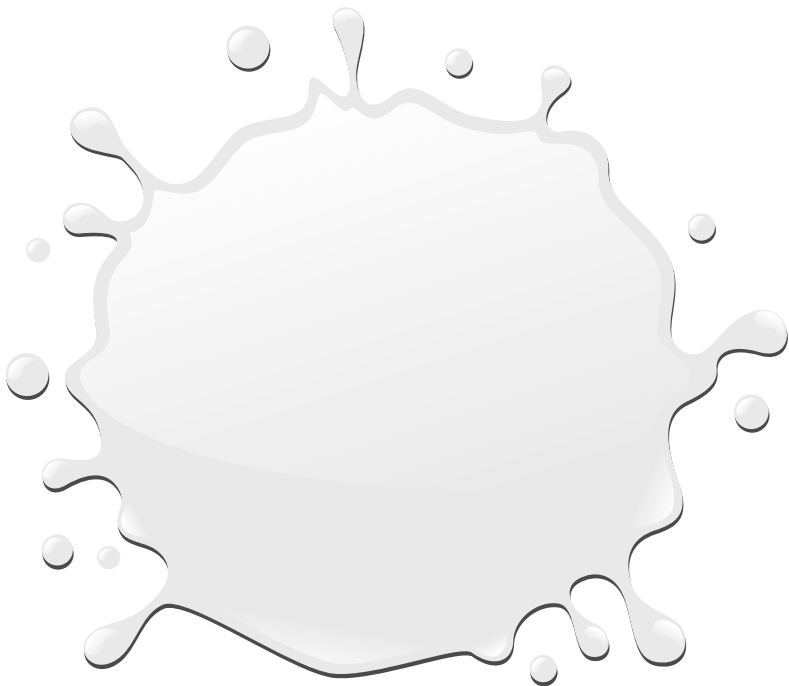
Stand for God

Q. How did Noah stand for God?

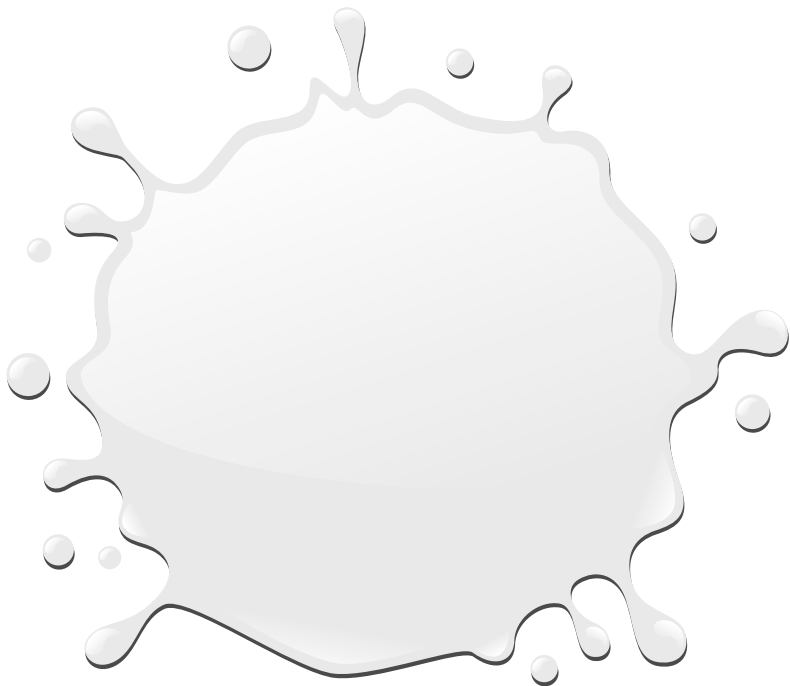
2 Peter 2:5

Psalm 94:16–19

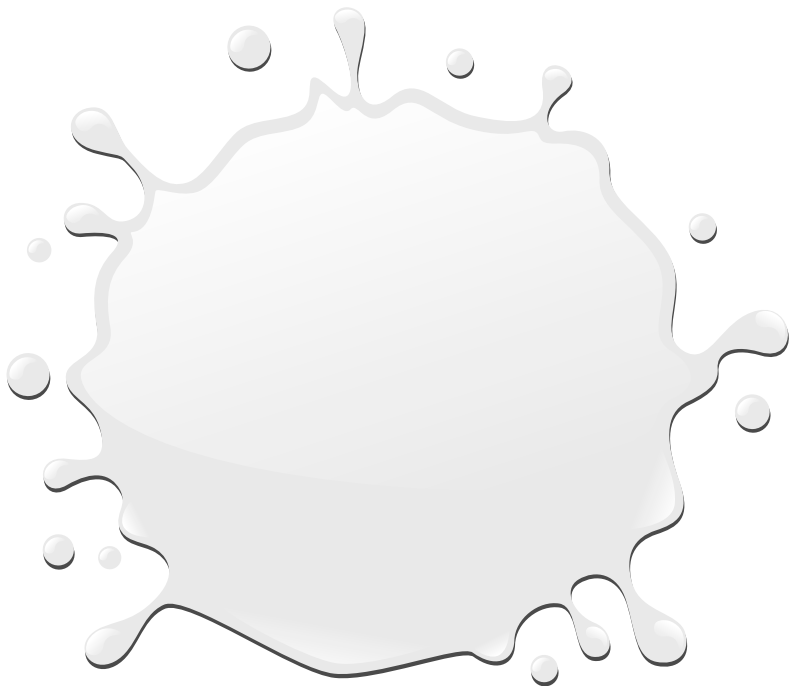


A. The Lord helps us to stand for Him.

in order to stand for God?

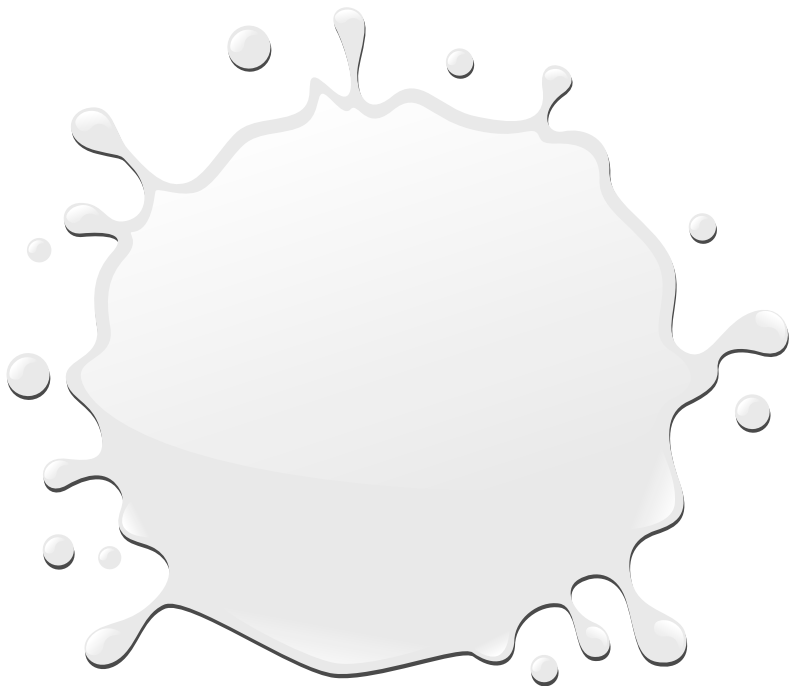
Ephesians 6:10–18

Philippians 2:12–16; Matthew 5:14–16

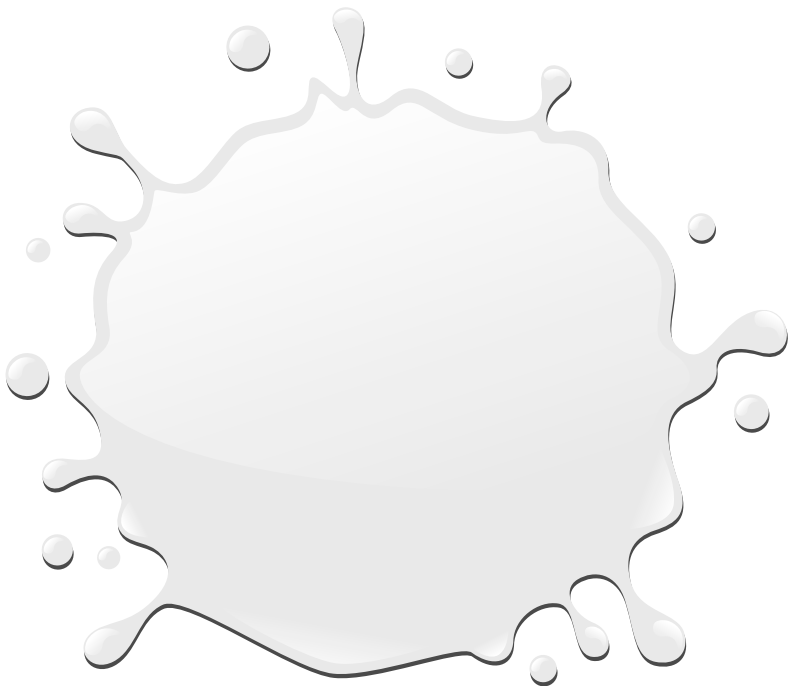


A. We need to shine as lights to the sinful people around us so we can glorify God.

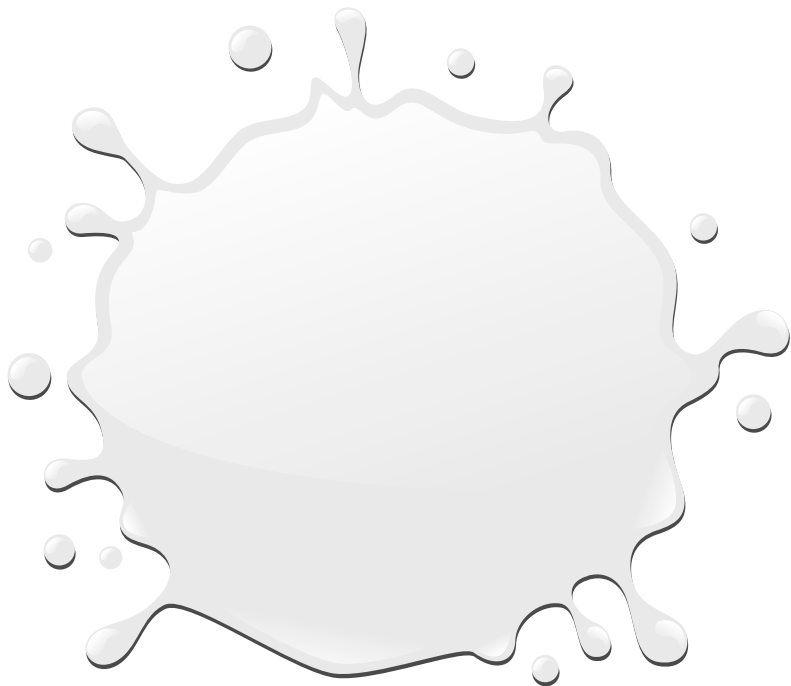
Obey God

Q. How did Noah obey God?

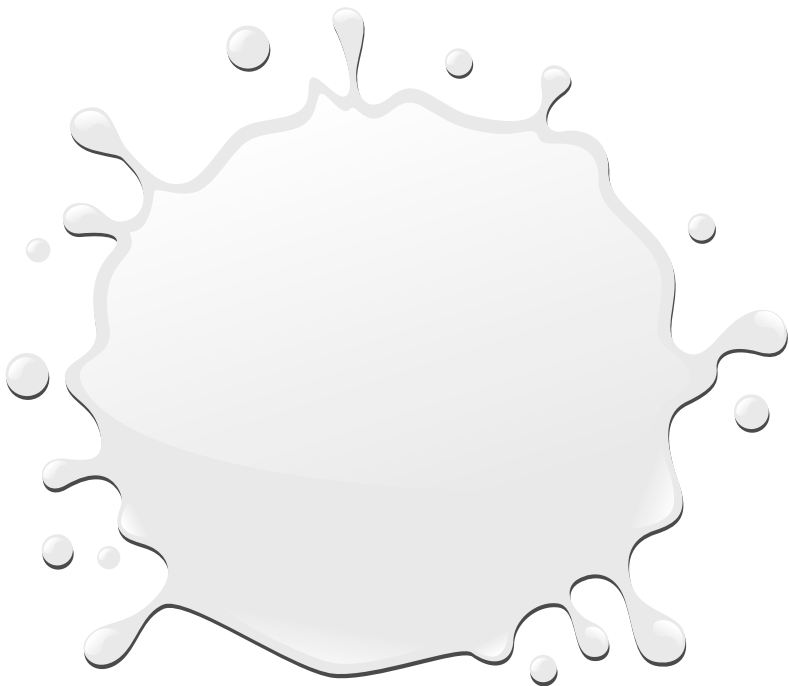
Genesis 6:13–22; 7:5

John 14:15-17

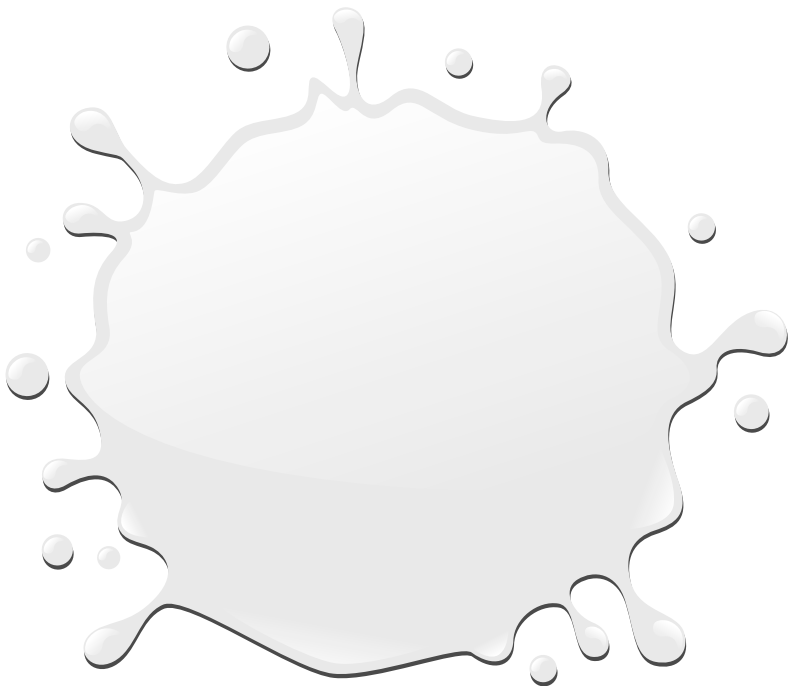


A. The Holy Spirit is given to those who are children of God to help them obey and love God.

Q. Why should we obey God?

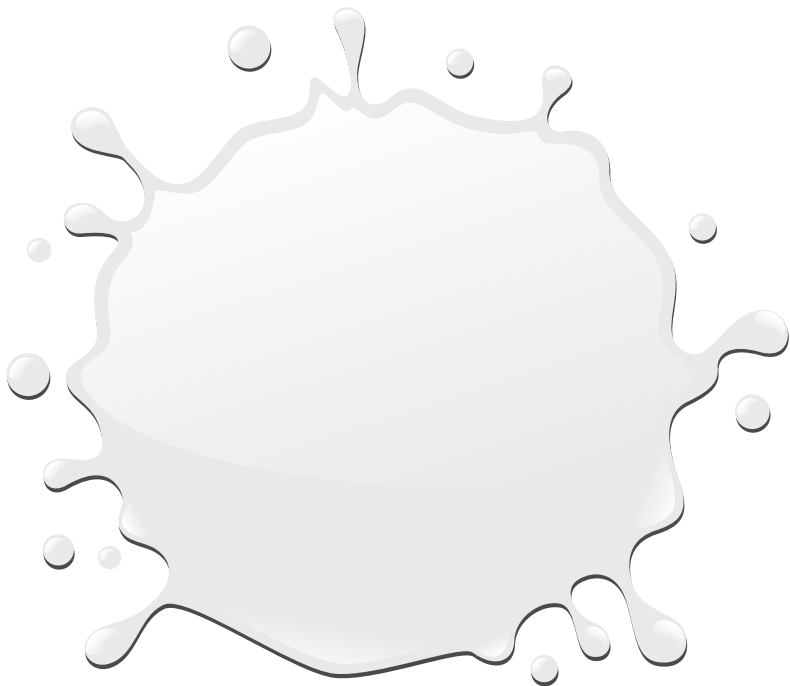
John 14:21–26

John 15:9–11

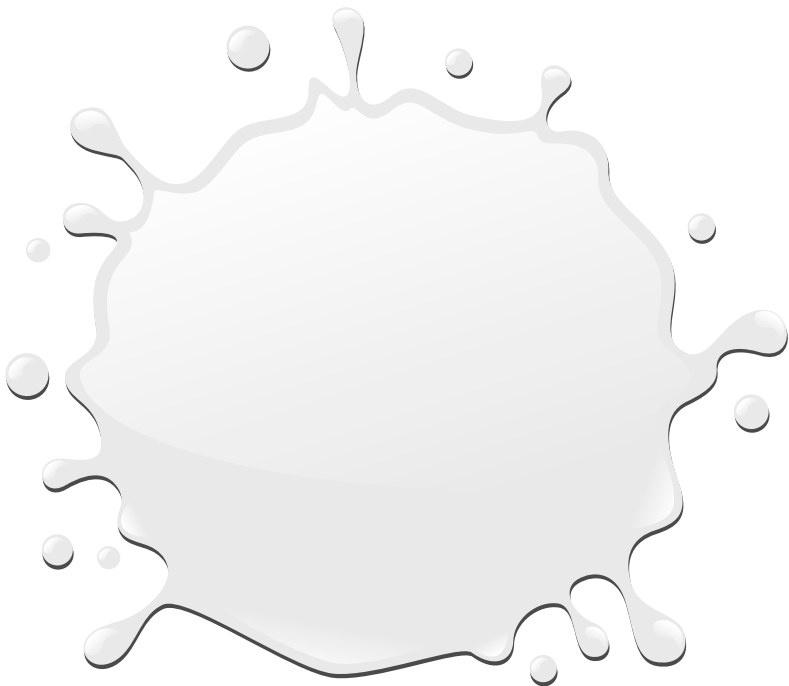


A. God gives us joy when we obey Him out of a heart of love for Him.

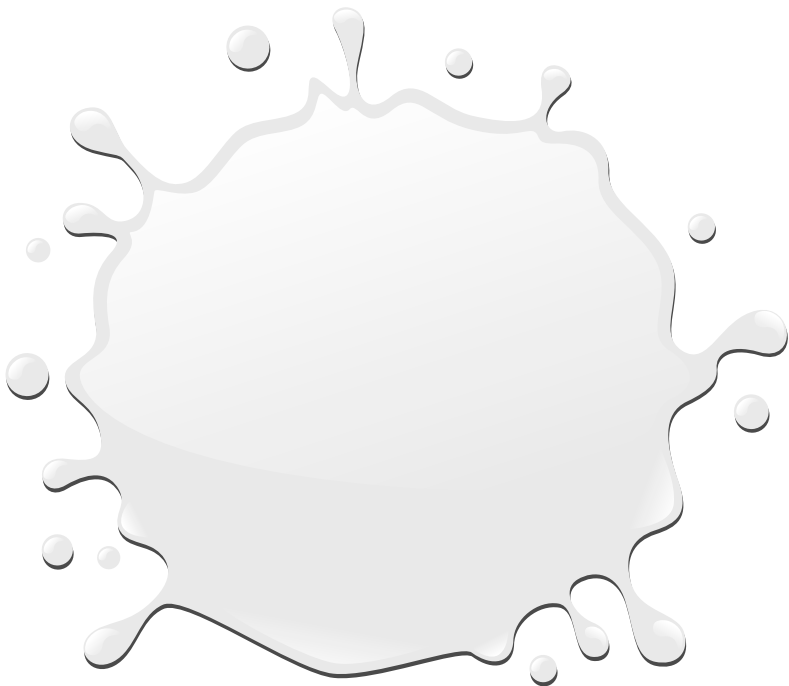
Trust God

Q. How did Noah trust God?

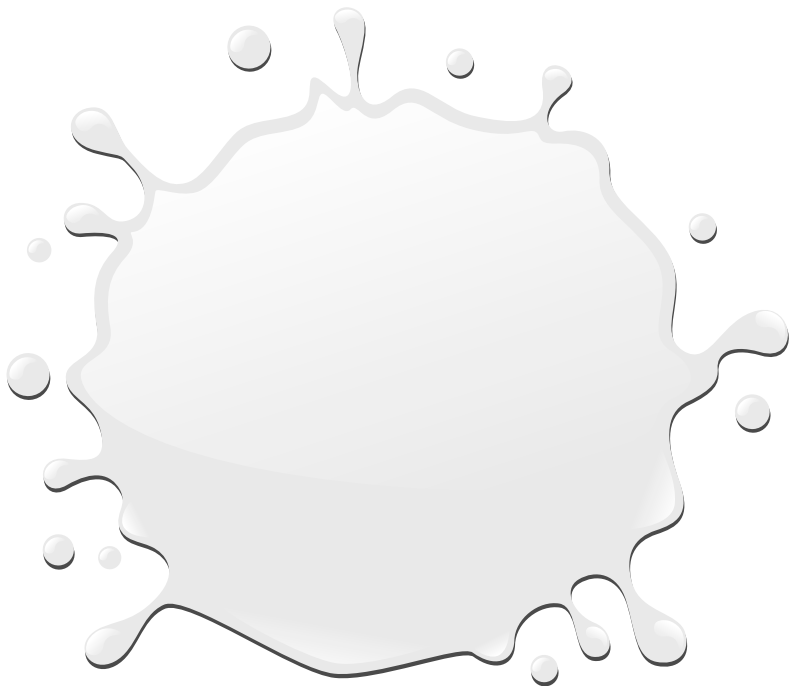
Genesis 7:13–16

WEEK 5 • DAY 3

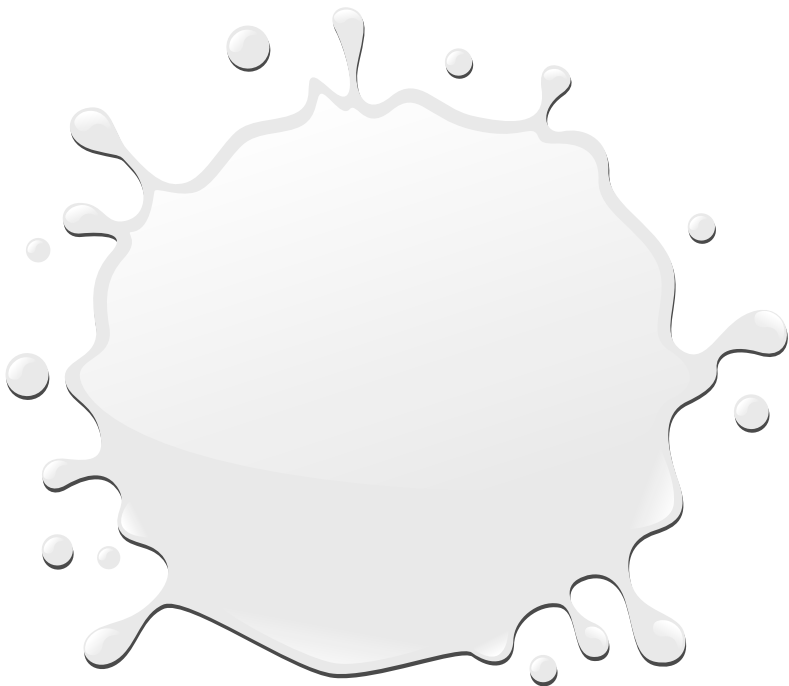
Q. How does God save us from His judgment on sin? How can we become a child of God?

Romans 10:9–10

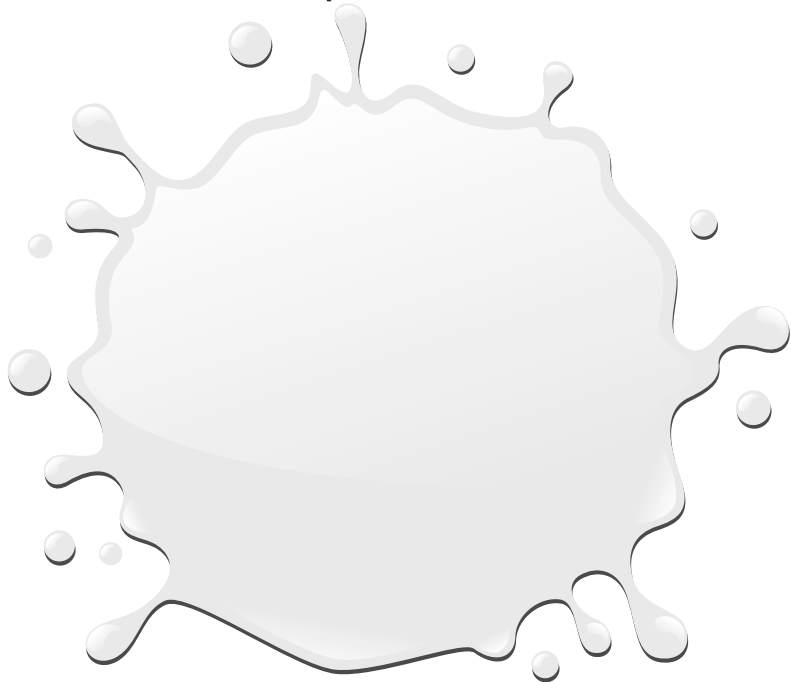


*A. We need to believe that Jesus died on the cross

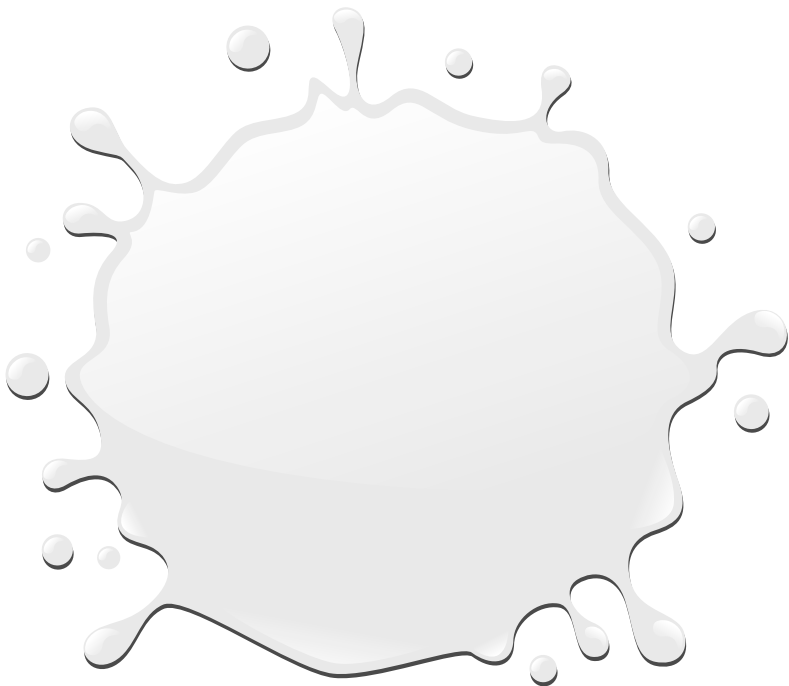
Thank God

Q. How did Noah thank God?

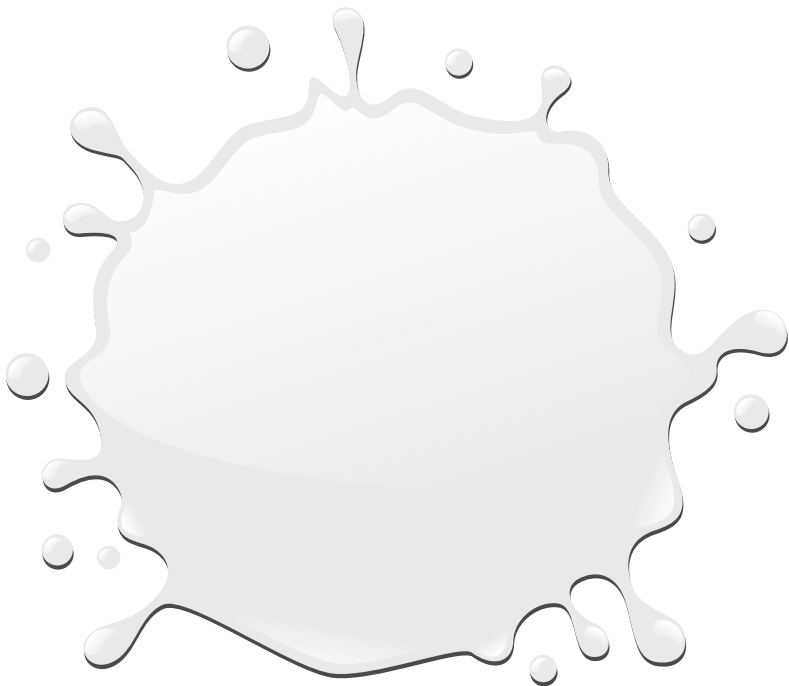
Genesis 8:15–22

Psalm 136:1–3

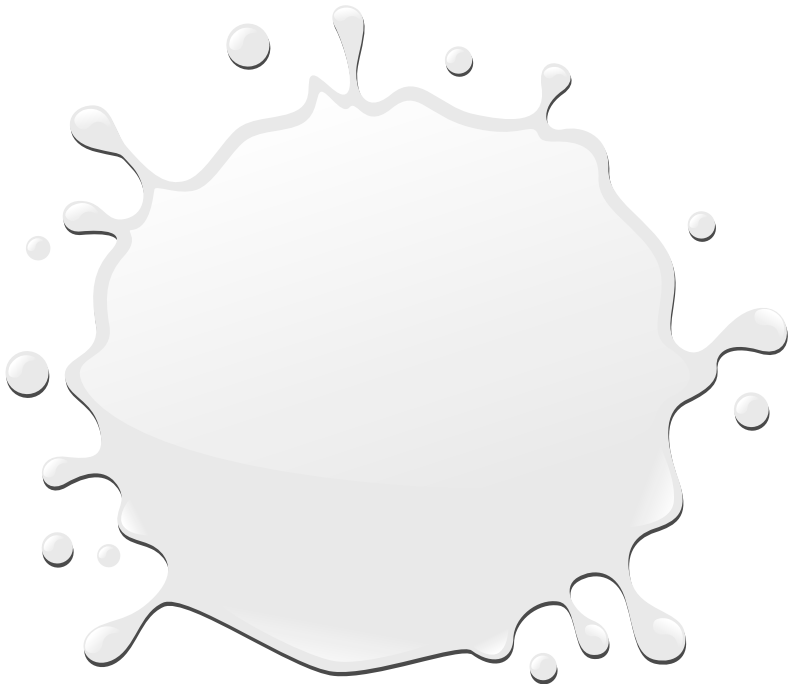


A. We can thank God for who He is, His goodness, and His mercy.

Q. What do these verses teach us to give thanks to God for?

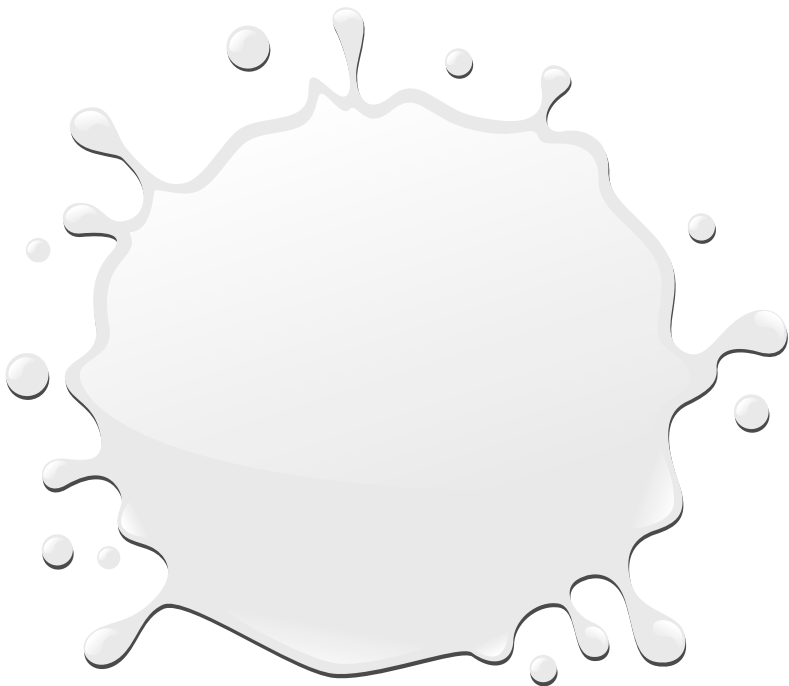
Psalm 136:4–9

Psalm 136:23–26

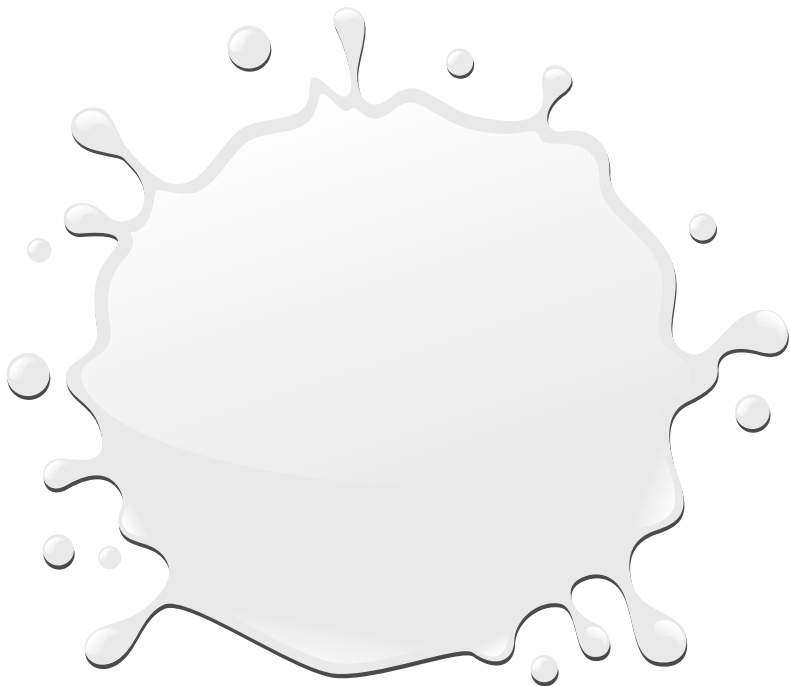


A. We can thank God for saving us, for providing for us.

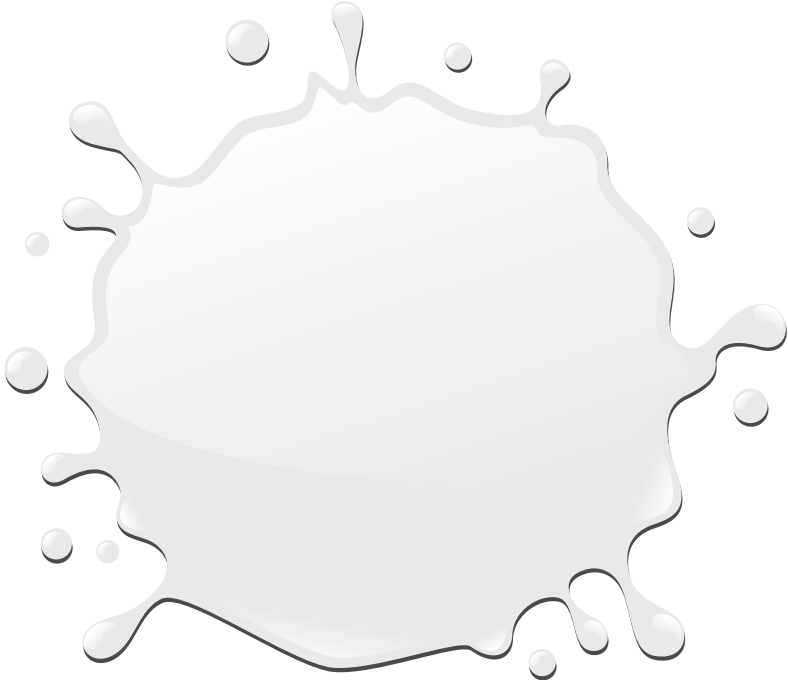
Fear God

Q. How did Noah show he feared God (took God seriously)?

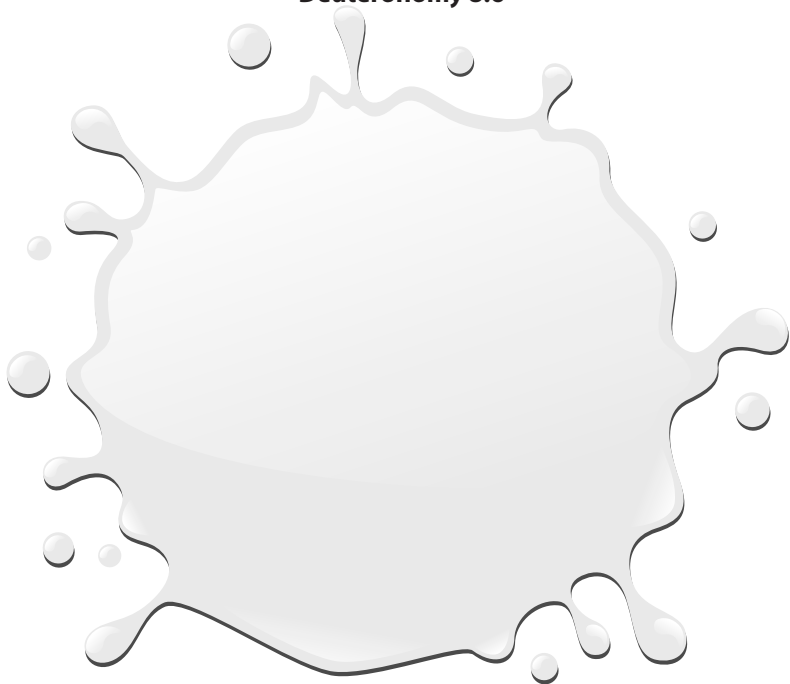
Hebrews 11:7

Deuteronomy 8:6

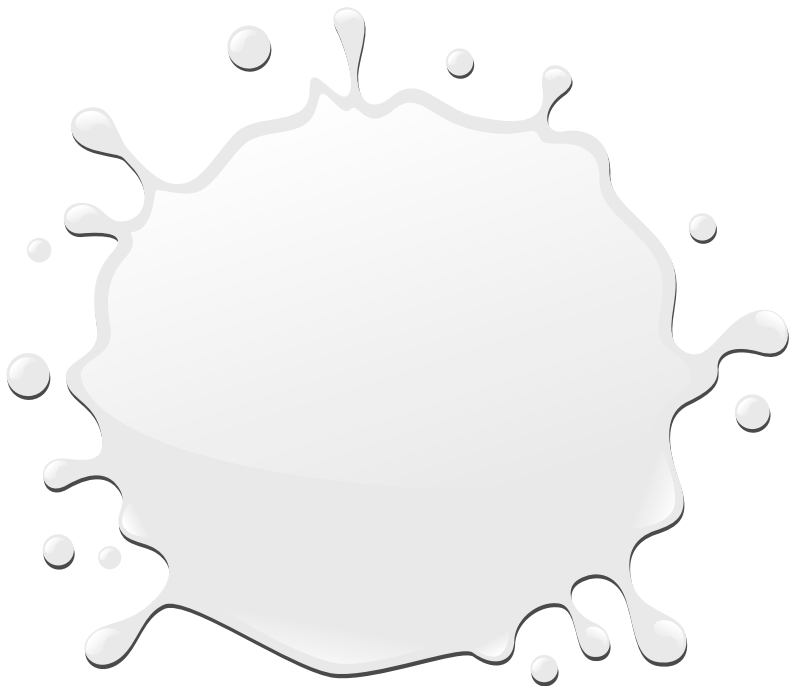


A. By obeying God's commands.

Q. Who should fear the Lord?

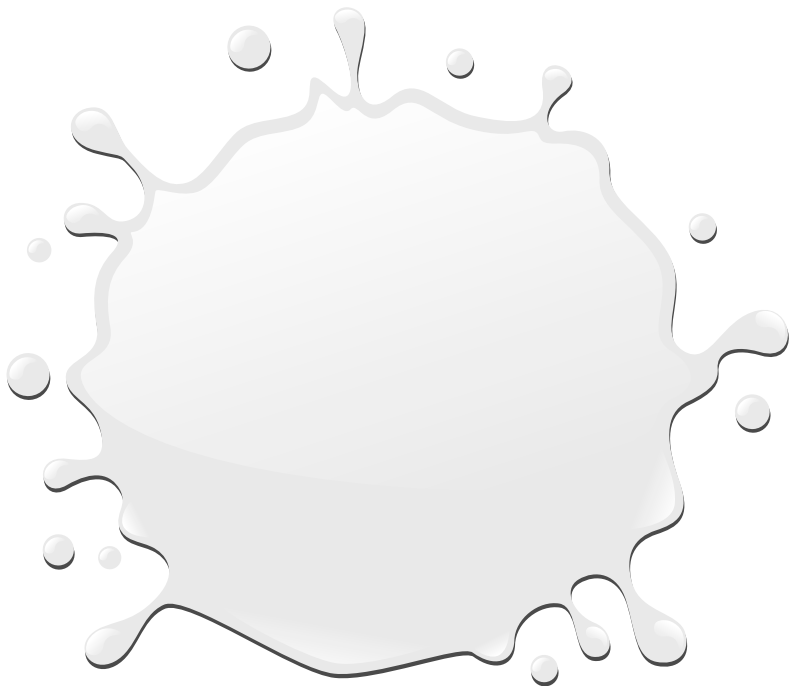
Psalm 33:8

Proverbs 8:13

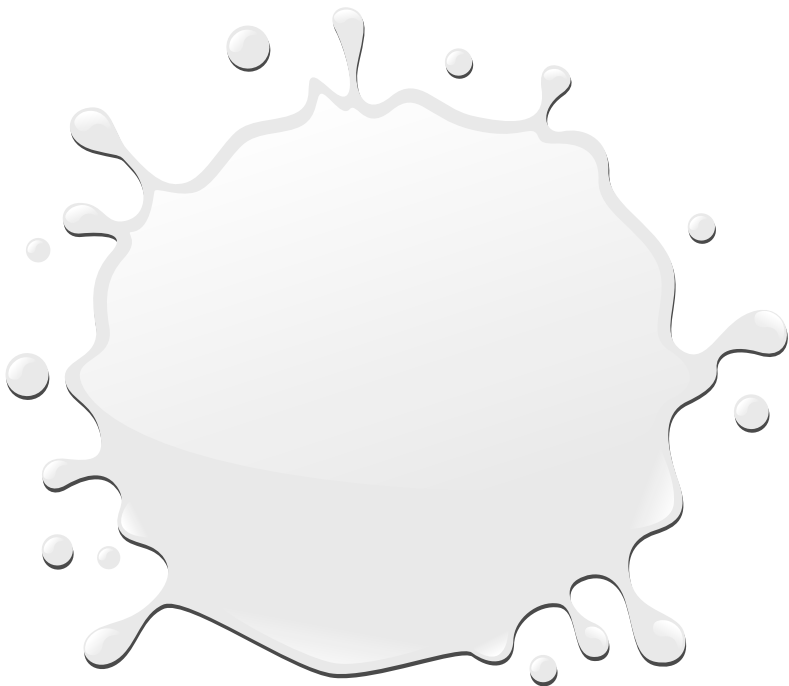


A. When we fear God, we will hate evil, pride, arrogance, and a perverse mouth.

Q. Whom should we fear?

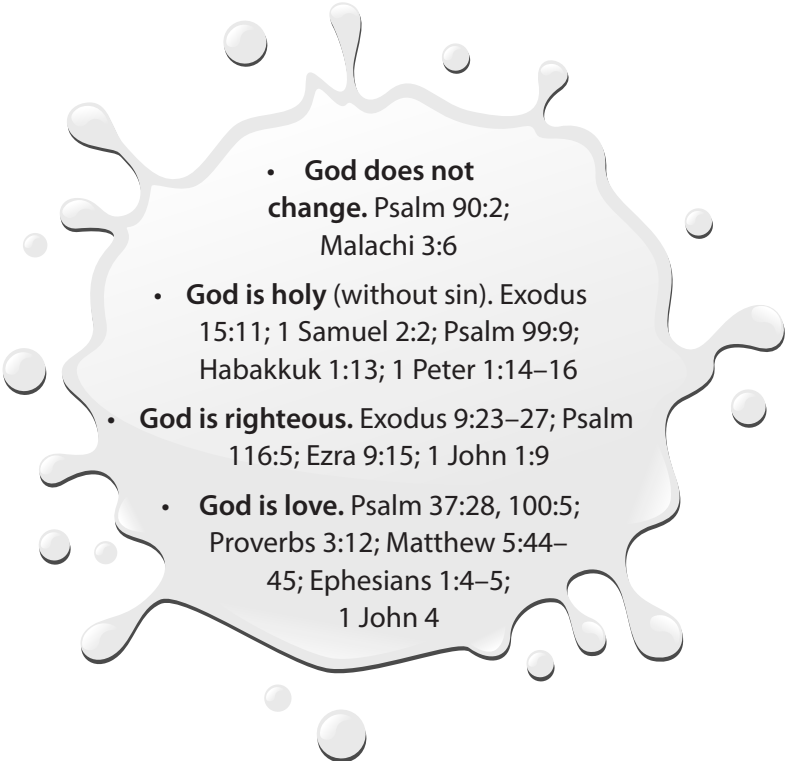
Proverbs 29:25



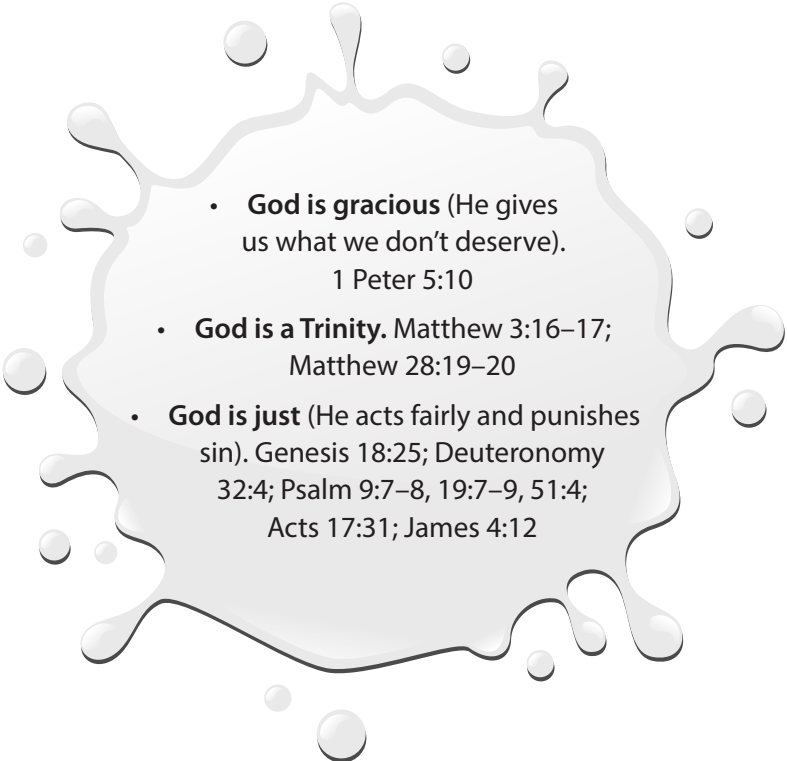
A. We should fear God more than we fear people.

- **God does not change.** Psalm 90:2;
Malachi 3:6
 - **God is holy** (without sin). Exodus 15:11; 1 Samuel 2:2; Psalm 99:9; Habakkuk 1:13; 1 Peter 1:14–16
 - **God is righteous.** Exodus 9:23–27; Psalm 116:5; Ezra 9:15; 1 John 1:9
 - **God is love.** Psalm 37:28, 100:5; Proverbs 3:12; Matthew 5:44–45; Ephesians 1:4–5; 1 John 4

- **God is sovereign** (rules over everything; is in control of everything). Genesis 1; Job 12:13–25, 37:2–13; Psalm 22:28, 115:3; Isaiah 40:21–26; Daniel 2:21, 4:35; 1 Timothy 6:15
 - **God is merciful** (He doesn't give us what we deserve). Deuteronomy 4:31; Psalm 51, 103:8; Romans 5:8; Ephesians 2:4

- **God is gracious** (He gives us what we don't deserve).
1 Peter 5:10
 - **God is a Trinity.** Matthew 3:16–17;
Matthew 28:19–20
 - **God is just** (He acts fairly and punishes sin). Genesis 18:25; Deuteronomy 32:4; Psalm 9:7–8, 19:7–9, 51:4;
Acts 17:31; James 4:12
