Review Game Questions and Answers

1. What is at least one way we know early people were not apemen but were very smart?

Answers will vary, but may include: Cain built a city; apemen couldn't do that. Jubal played the harp and flute; apemen couldn't do that. Tubal-Cain made tools from iron and bronze; apemen couldn't do that.

2. Fill in the blank: _____ is receiving a gift from God we don't deserve.

Grace. (Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord.)

3. What was yesterday's lifeline verse?

1 Corinthians 16:13: "Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong."

KJV: "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong."

4. Who was yesterday's animal pal?

Hydro the Whale. (Hydro reminds us there's a whale of a problem.)

5. Why did God destroy the earth with the Flood?

Answers will vary, but should include: The earth was corrupt and full of violence. The Flood was God's judgment on the sin of mankind.

6. Yes or No: Noah was perfect in his generation. This means he never sinned.

No. (Noah did sin. We all sin, but he was not intentionally disobeying God all the time.)

7. Who told Noah to build the Ark?

A. Jonah

B. Noah saw it in a dream

C. God

D. Moses

C—God.

8. Who is the animal pal today?

Hammer the Shark. (Hammer reminds us to nail obedience.)

9. How long is a cubit?

A cubit was the measurement of the length from the tip of a man's finger to his elbow. This will vary depending on the person's arm size, but Answers in Genesis has chosen to go with a cubit of 20½ inches long in calculating the size of the Ark.

10. True or False—There were dinosaurs on the Ark.

True. (God brought representatives of every kind of land animal (including dinosaurs) to the Ark. It could be that the dinosaurs on the Ark were younger and therefore smaller dinosaurs, instead of older, larger ones.)

1. **Fill in the blank: Hammer the Shark reminds us to _____.**
Hammer the Shark reminds us to nail obedience.
2. **True or False: God likes chaos.**
False. (1 Corinthians 14:33 says God is a God of order. He gave Noah detailed orders for building the Ark.)
3. **How long were Noah and his family on the Ark?**
About one year.
4. **What is today's lifeline verse?**
Psalm 31:14: "But as for me, I trust in You, O Lord; I say 'You are my God.'"
KJV: "But I trusted in thee, O Lord: I said, Thou art my God."
5. **Yes or No: Did Noah obey God's commands?**
Yes. (Genesis 6:22 says he obeyed all God commanded him to do.)
6. **Describe the size of the Ark.**
Answers will vary, but may include: It was 3 decks high (50 ft. tall), a little more than 1½ football fields long (510 ft. long), and 2 school buses wide (85 ft. wide).
7. **Who is today's animal pal?**
Piers the Puffin. (He reminds us to trust the Lord and get on board.)
8. **How did the animals get on the Ark?**
 - A. Noah went around and got them.
 - B. Noah made his sons catch them.
 - C. Noah blew a horn to round them up.
 - D. They came on their own by God's direction.

D. They came on their own by God's direction.
9. **Why did Jesus die on the cross?**
Review the gospel. We have each sinned (disobeyed God's commands). We all deserve the punishment for sin, which is death and eternal separation from God's goodness forever. Jesus came to pay the penalty for sin on our behalf by dying on the cross. He was perfect and did not deserve to die, but He died in our place, bearing our sin, so God can forgive our sins, and we can live with Him forever.
10. **Is Jesus still dead?**
NO! (He rose from the dead and is now and forever alive!)

Review Game Questions and Answers

1. How is Jesus our “Ark of salvation”?

Noah entered the Ark, that God had provided, in order to be saved from God’s watery judgment. When we repent of our sin and believe in Jesus, we can be saved from God’s judgment on our sin.

2. What is today’s lifeline verse?

1 Thessalonians 5:18: “In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.”
KJV: “In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.”

3. Fill in the blank: Piers the _____ reminds us to trust the Lord and get _____.

Piers the Puffin reminds us to trust the Lord and get on board.

4. What is one evidence Flood covered the whole world?

Answers will vary: The best evidence is from God’s Word, that tells us the Flood covered all the high hills under the whole heaven. We also see evidence in rock layers and fossils found around the world.

5. True or False: Noah was the only one who followed God before the Flood.

True. (No one else was following God before He sent the Flood. Noah was standing alone.)

6. Are pictures of a “silly Ark” (one that is rounded with little animals sticking out of the windows) accurate?

No. (The Ark Noah built was a lot bigger and sturdier than that! It was six times longer than it was wide, was three decks high, was covered with a roof, and had one window and one door. There was plenty of room for all the animals, food, and water on the real Ark—there were no animals sticking their heads out for lack of room!)

7. How long did the waters prevail on the earth?

150 days.

8. True or False: The Flood waters covered the whole earth.

True. (According to Genesis, the waters covered all the high hills under the whole earth. And God promised to never send another worldwide flood. We have had other local floods, but God has kept His promise and never sent another worldwide flood.)

9. How many people were in Noah’s family?

Noah, his wife, his three sons, and three daughters-in-law. Eight people total.

10. How many of each animal kind came on the Ark?

God brought two of each kind of land-dwelling, air-breathing animals (seven of some).

Review Game Questions and Answers

- 1. Who was yesterday's animal pal?**
Paws the Otter. (Paws reminds us we "otter" thank God.)
- 2. What was yesterday's lifeline verse?**
1 Thessalonians 5:18: "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."
KJV: "In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you."
- 3. True or False: God said He would never flood the earth again unless everyone became corrupt and violent like they had been in Noah's days.**
False. (God promised NEVER to judge the entire earth again with water.)
- 4. Yes or No: Is it necessary to fear the Lord?**
Yes. (The Bible talks a lot about fearing the Lord—taking Him seriously.)
- 5. What is today's lifeline verse?**
Psalm 112:1: "Blessed is the man who fears the Lord."
KJV: "Blessed is the man that feareth the Lord."
- 6. How many people beside Noah's family got on the Ark?**
None. (The Bible tells us Noah was a preacher of righteousness, but only Noah and his family listened to God and got on the Ark.)
- 7. True or False: Everyone will go to heaven, no matter what they do or believe.**
False. (Only people who fear the Lord and admit [repent of their sins], believe [in Jesus and what He did on the cross], and forever receive Jesus will go to heaven.)
- 8. After you become a Christian, can you stop being part of God's family?**
No. (Once you join God's family, you are forever part of it!)
- 9. Why do so many different people groups have flood legends?**
Since all people have descended from the three sons and daughters-in-law of Noah, all people groups share the same memories of the great Flood, which have been passed down from generation to generation. The true account is in the Bible; the other accounts have been changed and distorted over time.
- 10. What was the first thing Noah did when he got off the Ark?**
Built an altar. (He thanked God for saving him. We should never get over the fact that God saved us!)
