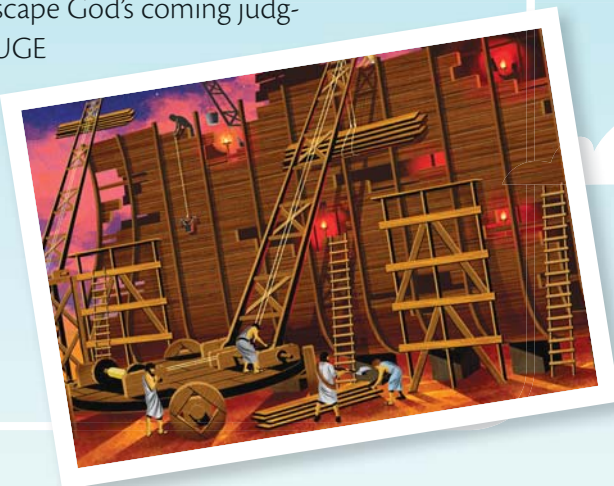
Day 2—Junior

Obey God!

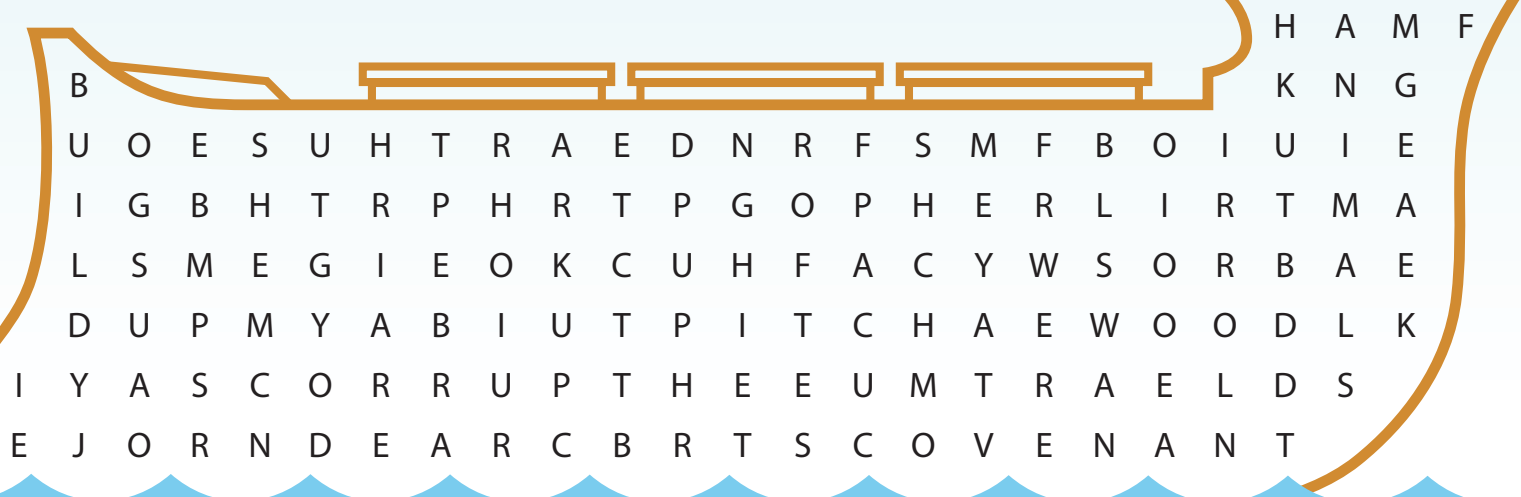

Day 3—Junior Trust God!

Hello, Divers! We hope you had a powerful time with our animal pal, Piers the Puffin. Piers reminded us that we need to trust God with our lives, just like Noah did. Even though people scoffed at Noah for building a boat, he never gave up. Noah trusted God and God saved him and his family from His judgment on sin (a worldwide Flood)! God brought two of every air-breathing, land-dwelling animal (seven of some) into the Ark, God shut the door, and God kept them safe while the ocean was in complete commotion! Today, God offers us a way to be saved from His judgment on sin, too! The people of Noah's time were sinners. They disobeyed God and received the penalty for sin, which is death. Did you know we still sin today? All of us have sinned (disobeyed God's commands), and the penalty for sin is death (Romans 3:23; 6:23). So, just as the Ark was the way God saved Noah and his family from death in the Flood, Jesus is the way God saves us now from eternal death for any who believe in Him.

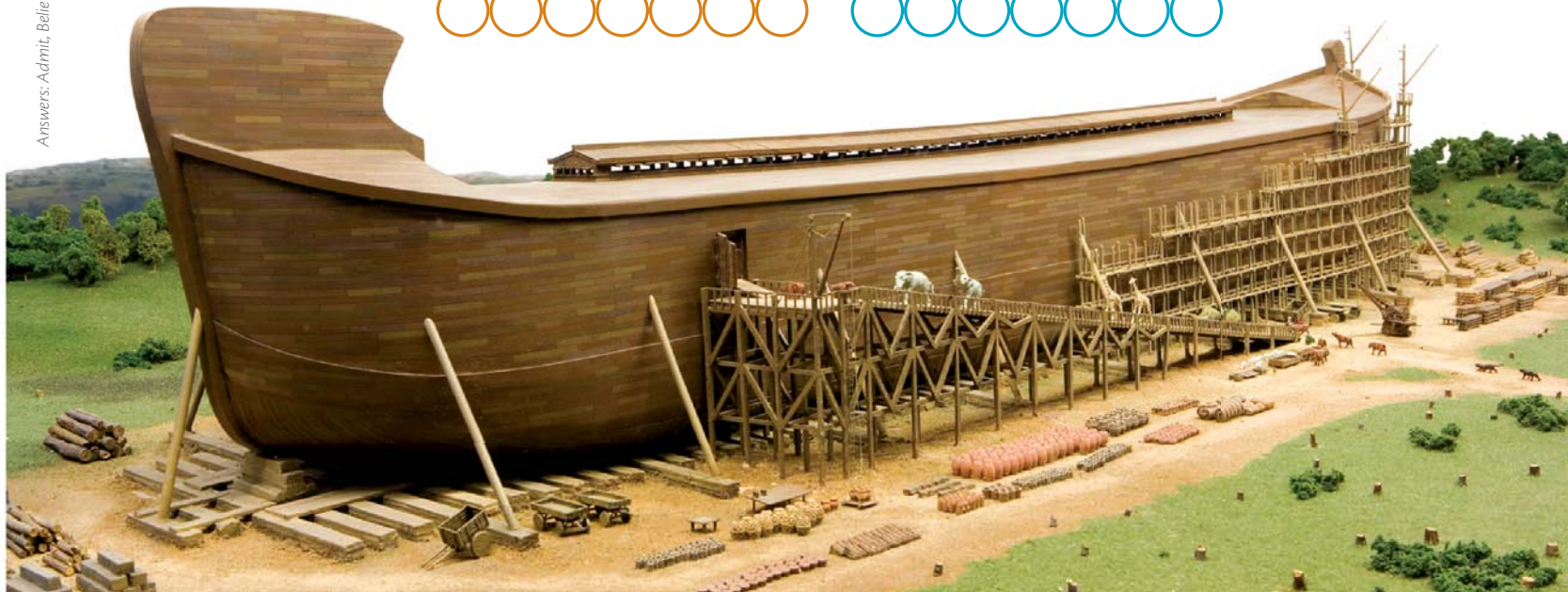

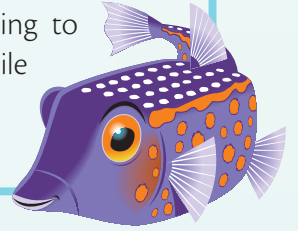

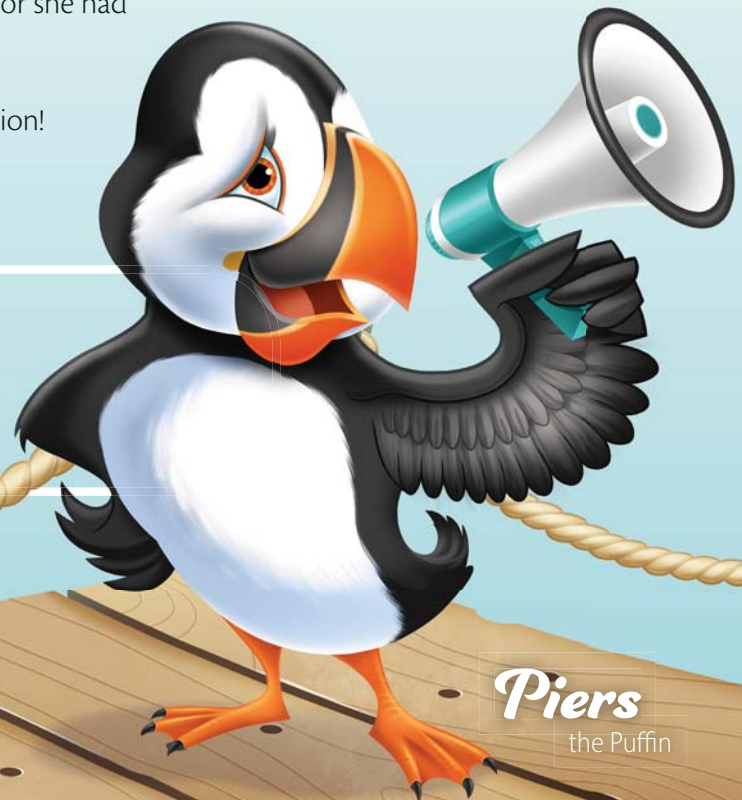


1. Say today's Lifeline Verse to someone (Psalm 31:14). Have you repented of your sin and trusted God with your life like Noah did?

Good day, Divers! Our animal pal, Paws, reminds us that we “otter” thank God. When Noah got off the Ark, he was very thankful that God had graciously saved him! Noah didn’t grumble about how the Flood caused great destruction all over the world. Instead, after surviving the year-long watery commotion in the ocean (God’s judgment on sin), he got off the Ark and immediately thanked God. Today, we met Detective B. Smart, who showed us evidence—in rock layers and fossils—that there was a worldwide catastrophic Flood that covered the entire earth about 4,300 years ago. Of course, the best evidence for the Flood of Noah’s day is given to us in the Bible—we can know those accounts are true because they come from God who cannot lie! And we can use those accounts to help us understand the world around us.

Just like Noah, we can rely on God to help us thank Him in everything.

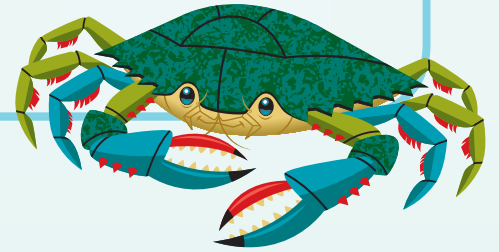

Tomorrow's Verse: Blessed is the man that feareth the Lord. Psalm 112:1



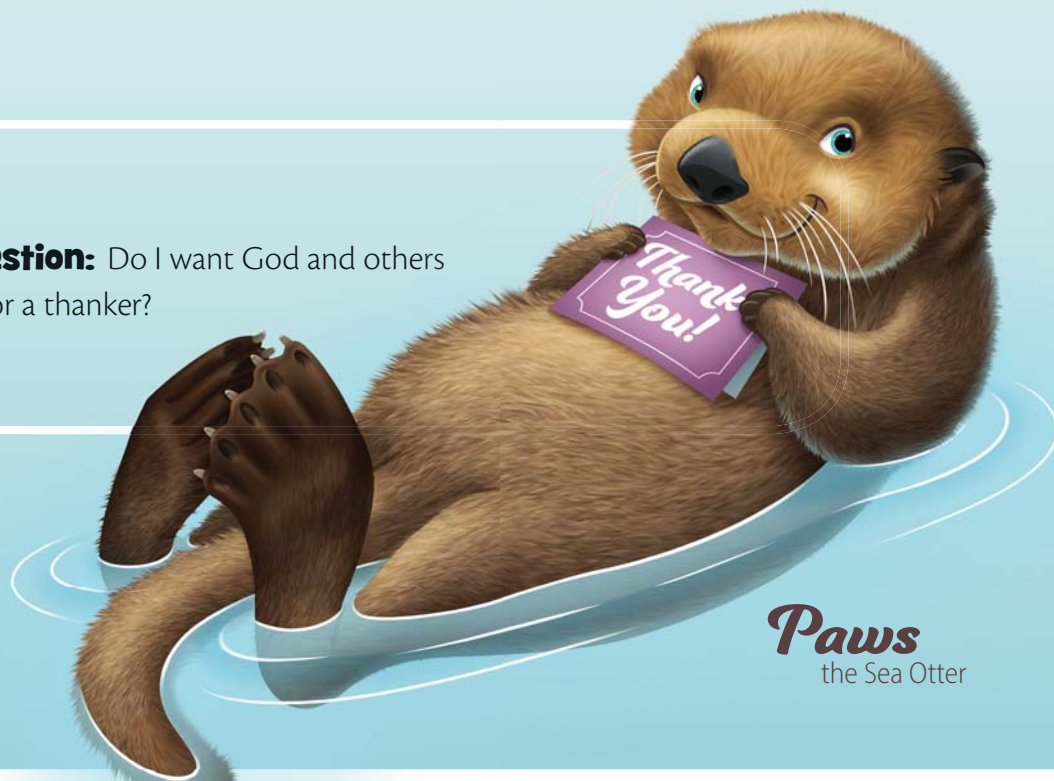

Hello, Divers! We hope you had a fun-tastic time at *Ocean Commotion* this week! Today, our animal pal, Fin the Dolphin, reminds us that “no-fin” is a bigger deal than to fear God (take God seriously). After the Flood, God made a promise (a covenant). God sent a rainbow as the sign of His promise to never flood the whole world again. It’s cool to think that water, which destroyed the earth, is what combines with sunshine to make a rainbow! When we see a rainbow, it should always remind us of God’s love and faithfulness. It should remind us to fear God, which means to take Him seriously, and to think of Him with awe and wonder.

Read Genesis 9:1–17. The Bible gives us the true account of the Flood of Noah’s day. And, since all people groups are descendants of Noah and his family, there are flood legends around the world that have been passed down since the time of Noah!
