From beginning to end, the Bible is like a love letter from God that tells us how we can be saved from our sin. Match the letters on the cross with the first letter of the color on the stickers. The hints below will help you remember what each color stands for.

**G** In the beginning, God created a beautiful garden filled with life (Genesis 1).

**B** Adam and Eve disobeyed God's command (this is called sin). Since that time, every person has disobeyed God's commands. The punishment for sin is death and eternal separation from God's goodness forever (Genesis 2–3, Romans 3:23, Matthew 10:28). When we sin, the Bible says we love darkness more than light (John 3:19–20).

**B** Adam and Eve's descendants continued to sin until God judged the world with a watery catastrophe (Genesis 6–9). Noah and his family (and some animals) were saved by going on the Ark. Today, Jesus is our "ark" of salvation!

**G** After Noah's family came off the Ark, their descendants disobeyed God's command to fill the earth and instead built a tall tower so they could stay together. God confused their languages, causing family groups to move away from each other (Genesis 10–11). This was the beginning of the various people groups, but we are all still related and in need of salvation!

**W** About 2,000 years ago, Jesus came to earth. He lived a perfect life and never sinned (check out the Gospels).

**R** Jesus died on the Cross to take the punishment for sin and rose three days later (Matthew 27–28).

**Y** When we repent of (turn from) our sins and believe that Jesus paid the penalty for our sins, we can receive the gift of eternal life (Acts 16:31) and live forever with God in heaven, where there are streets of gold (Revelation 21)!





## LIGHT IN A DARK PLACE

The Bible is a light to our path—it tells us how we can live for the glory of God! People who live in the Arctic need to use lights during the daytime for many months of the year. During those months, the sun doesn't rise, and it is very dark all day and night.
