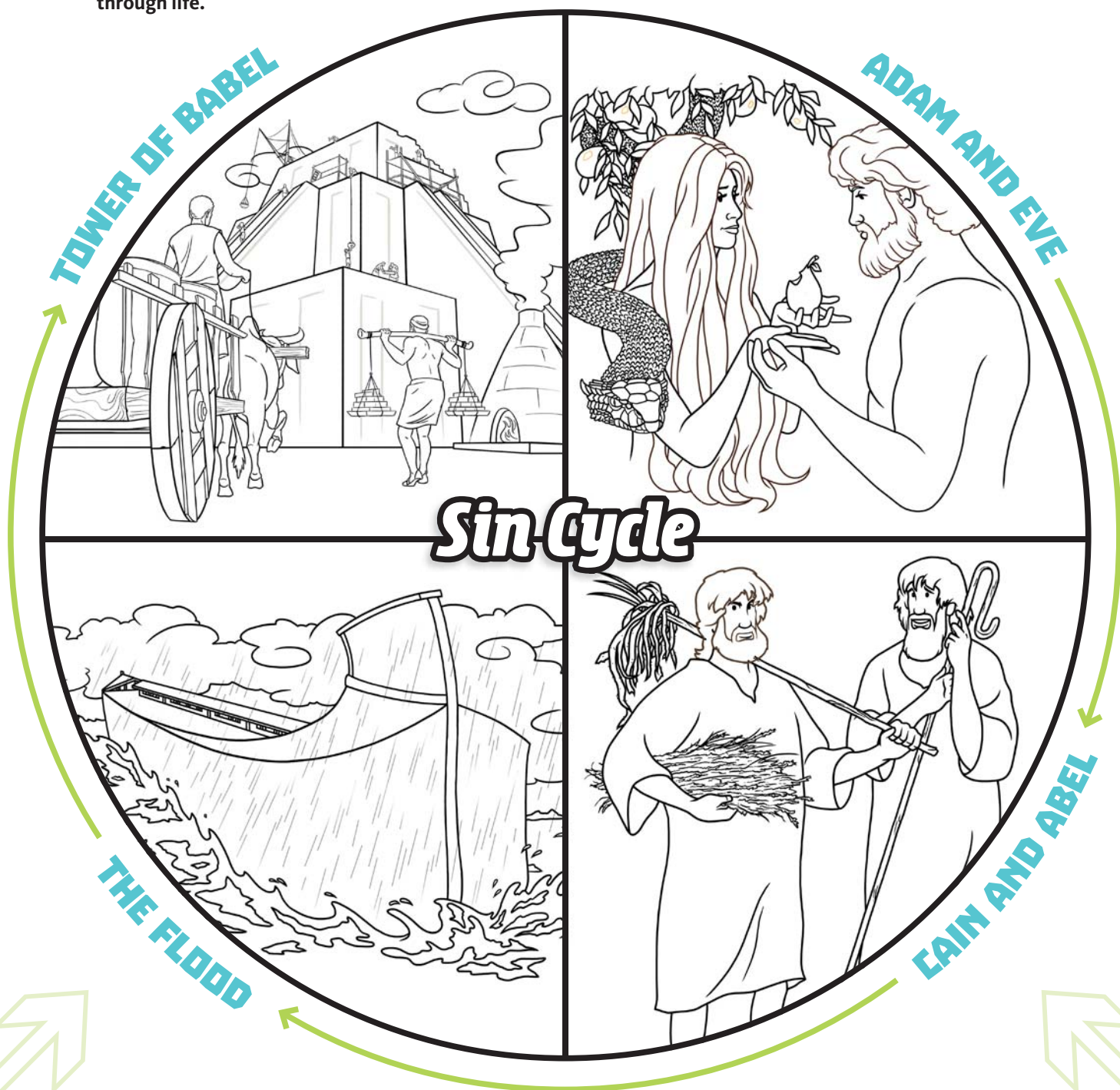




Ready, Set, Go: Before Babel

On this leg of the race, we stop at the tower of Babel and check out the important and loving roadblock God provided there.

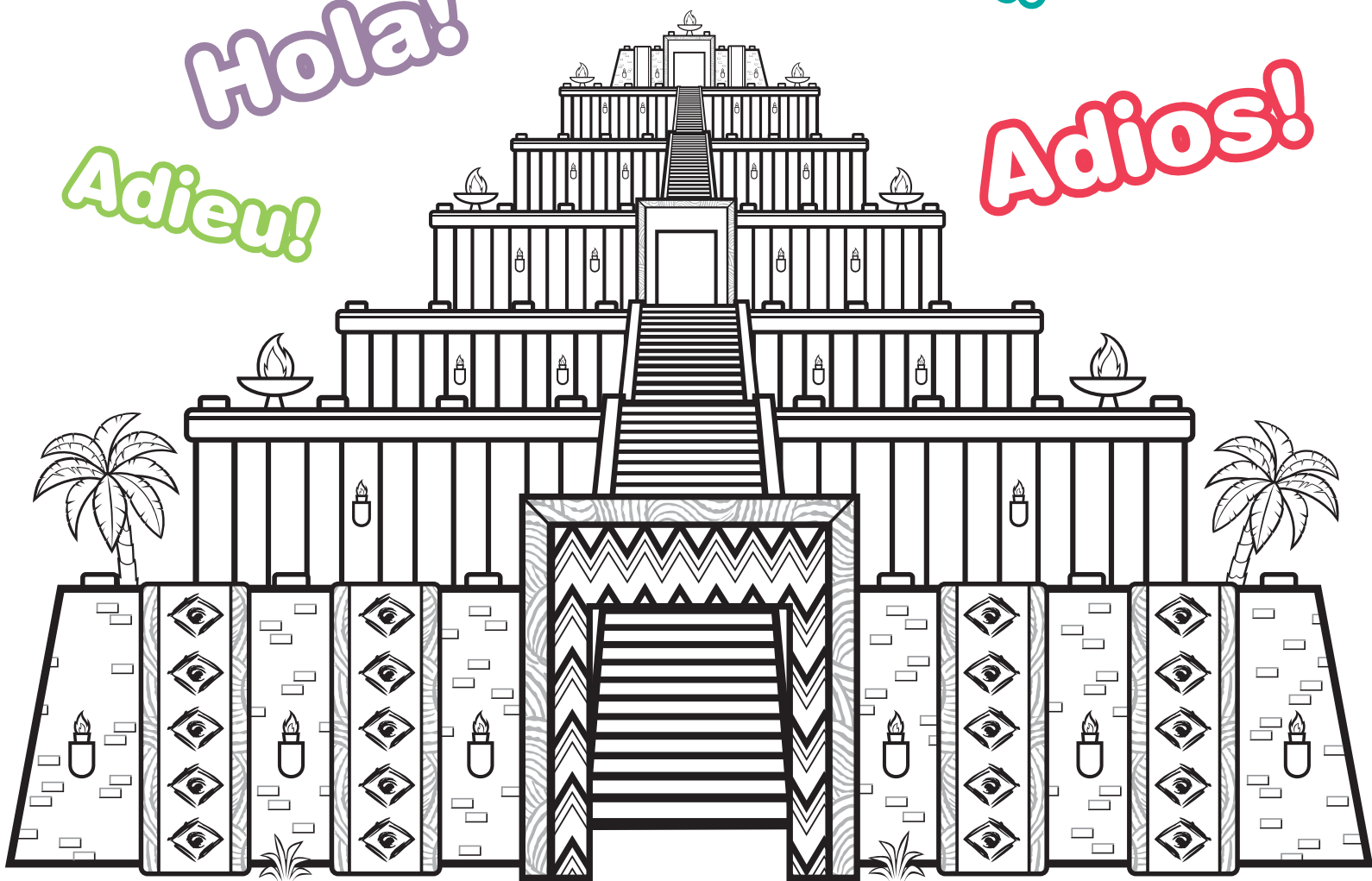

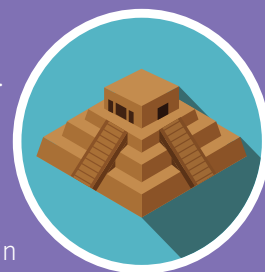


Mile Marker Memory Verse Challenge

One Race, Many Nations: After Babel

Jambo, racers! As you traveled to Africa today, you read how the Bible tells us God “scattered,” or “moved” the people from the tower of Babel when they didn’t obey him. When God moved the people away from Babel, they ended up all over the world, and over time, the families developed their own traditions and cultures and clothing styles. Though we might look a little different, we know that all people are part of the same race, the human race. Some people have a darker shade of skin color, some have a lighter shade of skin color, and some are in between. In our skin, God put melanin that helps to make skin different shades of brown. We don’t have different colors of skin, just different shades of the same basic color, brown!

On leg three, we see how the human race develops into people groups with different languages, cultures, and physical features, but how we are still one race.

Bonjour, racers! As you traveled to Europe, the next continent on *The Incredible Race*, you learned that you need a Savior from your sin! We each disobey God. The punishment for sin is death, and we will go to a terrible place called hell when we die. God sent his Son, Jesus, to earth to live a perfect life, die on the cross, and rise from the dead on the third day, taking the punishment for sin. God loved us so much he sent his Son, Jesus, so that anyone who admits they have sinned and believes in Jesus as their Savior can have eternal (forever) life and become a child of God!

On our fourth leg, we discover the need to yield our lives to God as he reaches out to all nations, tribes, and peoples with his love.
