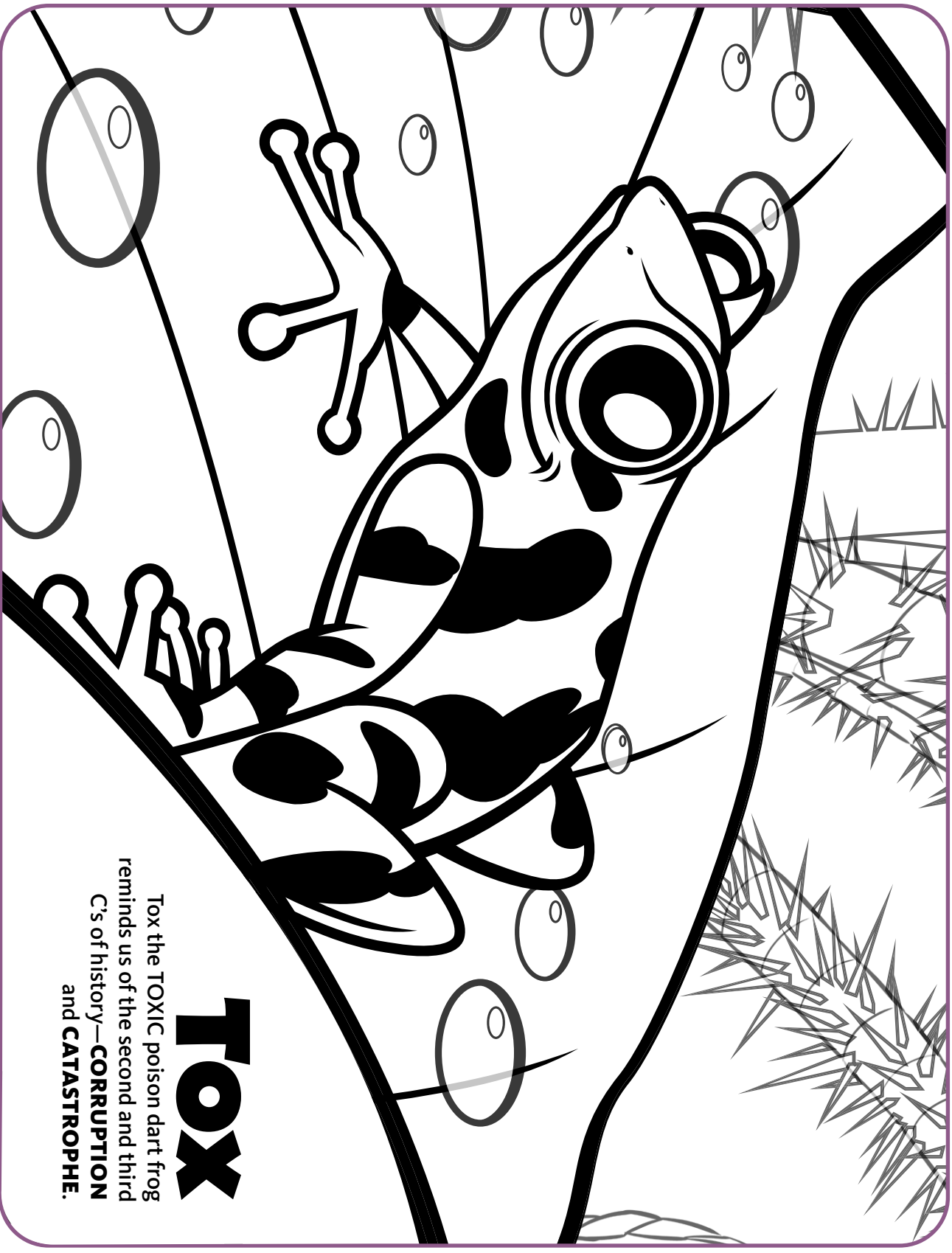

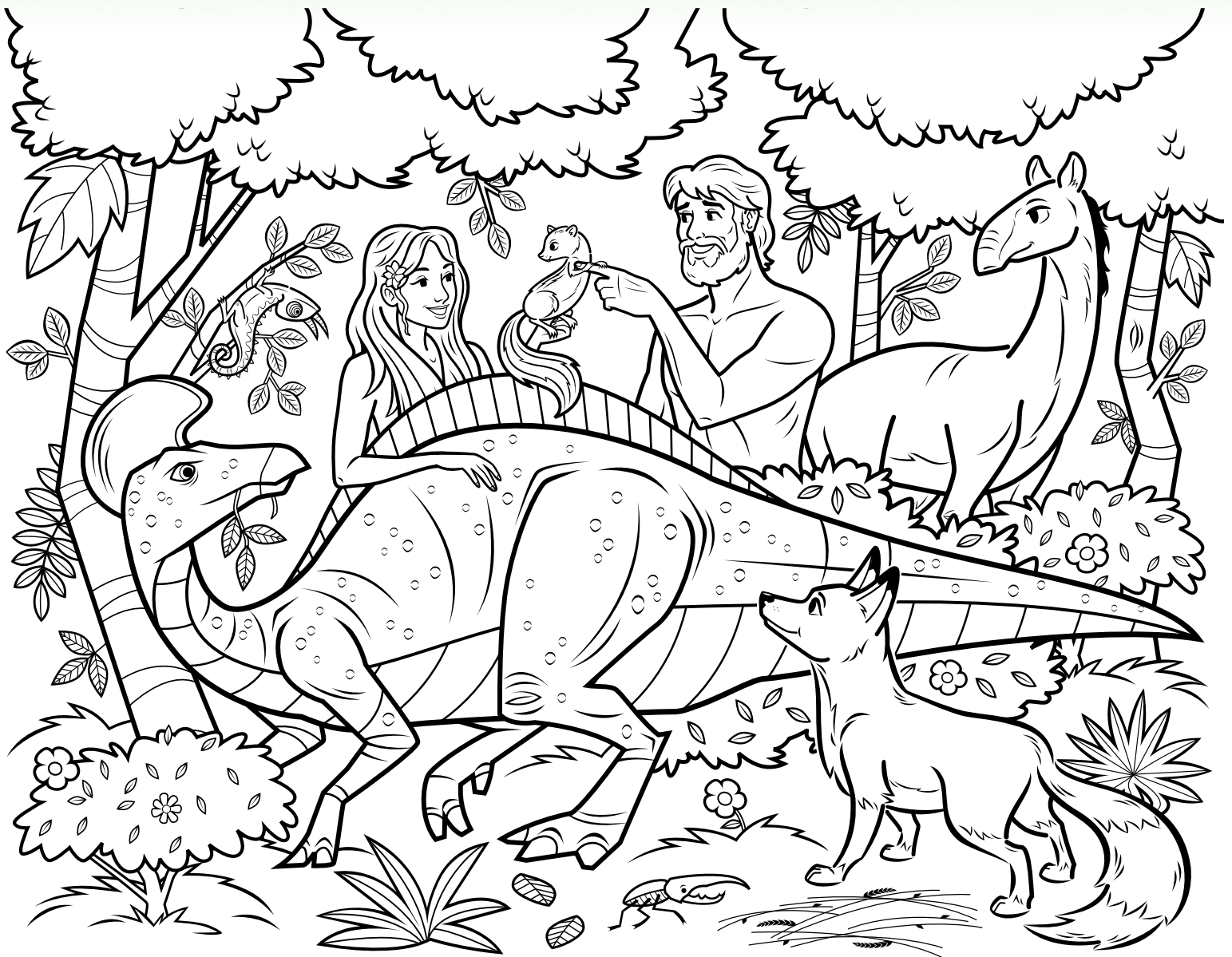
DAY 1: CREATION

All Is Good

Welcome aboard, travelers! We're cruising down the river through the 7 C's of History on our great jungle journey. Today we traveled back about 6,000 years to when the world began. We learned about the first C, **Creation**. God created the whole universe from nothing in just six normal days. God made everything—the air we breathe, the land and seas, flowers and trees, the sun, moon, and stars, fish and birds, land animals, and then people; Adam and Eve. We know this is all true because God's Word, the Bible, says so!

Today's Verse:

In the beginning, God created
the heavens and the earth.

Genesis 1:1

Challenge: Pretend you're a rainforest plant that's growing and growing as you say the verse. Crouch down low and say the verse in a whisper. Grow little by little with every time you say it, getting louder and louder, until you're standing tall with arms raised.

Ask yourself this question:

I enjoy his beautiful creation?



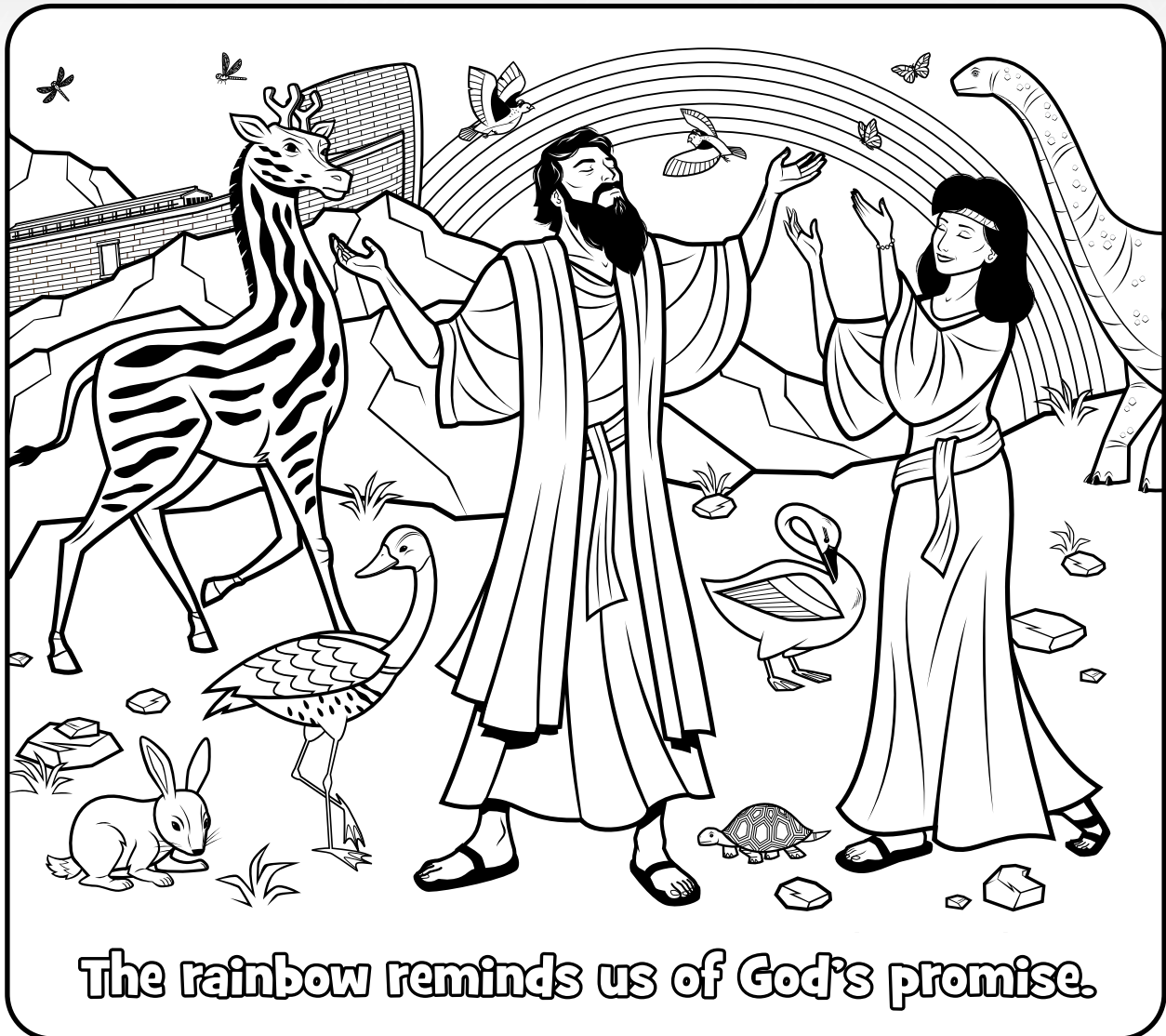
- Go on a walk and find at least 10 things God made. Praise him for them! Now see if you can remember what God made on each day of creation. You can check Genesis 1 in your Bible if you need help.
- Use your senses to praise our Creator God. First, with an adult, taste a food and praise God (thank him) for it. Go outside and use your eyes to see something God has made. Smell something good, listen for something, and touch something God has made. Praise God for each thing.
- Pray and tell God what an amazing, good Creator he is! Thank him for something he has created.

DAY 2: CORRUPTION & CATASTROPHE

All Sin

Welcome back, travelers! Today on our great jungle journey, we explored some of the dark places in the jungle. First we learned about the second C, **Corruption**. The Bible tells how Adam and Eve sinned when they disobeyed God. Since then, the world has both good and bad in it. People do wrong things, and bad things happen. Adam and Eve's grandchildren became so sinful that God had to judge their sin by sending a global flood. This is the third C, **Catastrophe**. (A catastrophe is a terrible event.) Water covered the whole world, and only Noah and his family and the animals God sent were saved on the ark.

Challenge: Tree frogs can jump 150 times their length. See if you can leapfrog while you say your verse.

Ask yourself this question:
**Do I want to trust and
obey God?**



- Go on a hunt around your house and see how many dark-colored items and blue items you can find. What C's do these colors remind you of? (Corruption and Catastrophe)
- God loves it when we trust and obey him like Noah did. That's one way to honor God! Talk to an adult about a way you can obey God today.
- Pray (talk to God) and ask him to forgive you when you sin and help you trust him.

DAY 3: CONFUSION

All in Confusion

Our jungle journey today took us to the fourth C, **Confusion**. The Bible says that God told the people to move all around the world, but they disobeyed God and began to build a city and a tall tower instead. So God confused their language by changing the way they talked. Suddenly, the people couldn't understand each other anymore! So they all left with their families and scattered around the world. That's why there are different people groups who speak in different languages all over the earth. But no matter where we live or what language we speak, we are all part of the same human race!

God scattered the people. Use different colors to trace their paths.

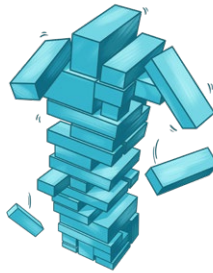




Today's Verse:

**Babel . . . there the LORD confused
the language of all the earth.
Genesis 11:9**


Challenge: Use 12 boxes or other stackable items. Put one down and say the first word of the verse. Put another down and say the next word. See if you can stack all 12 and say the whole verse before your tower falls down.



Tomorrow's Verse: But to all who . . . believed . . . he gave the right to become children of God.
John 1:12

Ask yourself this question:
Do I want to obey God, or do I only
do what I want, like the people
did at the tower of Babel?



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- The people all spoke the same language until God confused it by making different languages. Ask a grown-up to help you learn different ways people say "hello." French: "bonjour" (bohn-ZHOOR), Italian: "ciao" (chow), German: "guten tag" (GOO-ten tahk), Hawaiian: "aloha" (ah-LO-ha), Taiwanese: "lí-hó" (LEE-ho).



- Have someone read Genesis 11:1–9 to you and talk about what happened at the tower of Babel.
- Pray (talk to God) and ask him to help you obey him.

DAY 4: CHRIST & CROSS

Savior for All Who Believe

Today we stopped on our jungle journey cruise at two exciting places, the fifth and sixth C's, **Christ** and **Cross**. We've already learned that all people sin and are separated from a holy God. But today we saw God's plan to help us with our sin problem. The Bible says that God loves us so much, he sent his perfect Son, Jesus Christ, to earth as a baby. We celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas each year. As Jesus grew up, he never sinned because he is God! But some sinful people nailed Jesus to a cross, and he died. This was all part of God's plan. Jesus took the punishment for our sins when he died on the cross. But after three days, Jesus came back to life! We celebrate this great day at Easter. When we admit our sin and believe in Jesus, God gives us eternal life.

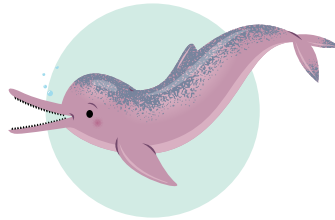

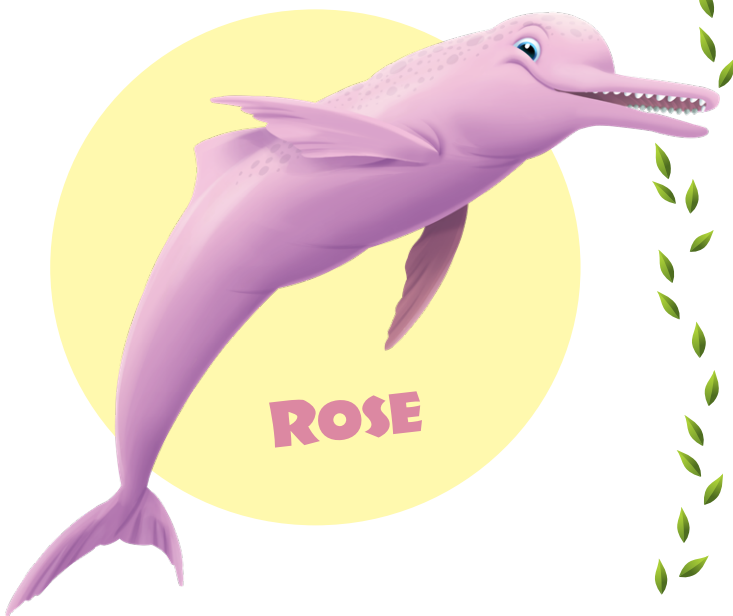

DAY 5: CONSUMMATION

The Bible says that God will destroy the old world and make a brand-new heaven and earth someday. All of God's children, those who have turned from their sin (repented) and put their trust in Jesus, will live in the new heaven and earth. It will be beautiful and wonderful because there will be no sin! Nothing bad or sad will be there—no sickness, no death, no crying, no hurting. And best of all, God's children will be with Jesus forever!

today's verse as you say it.



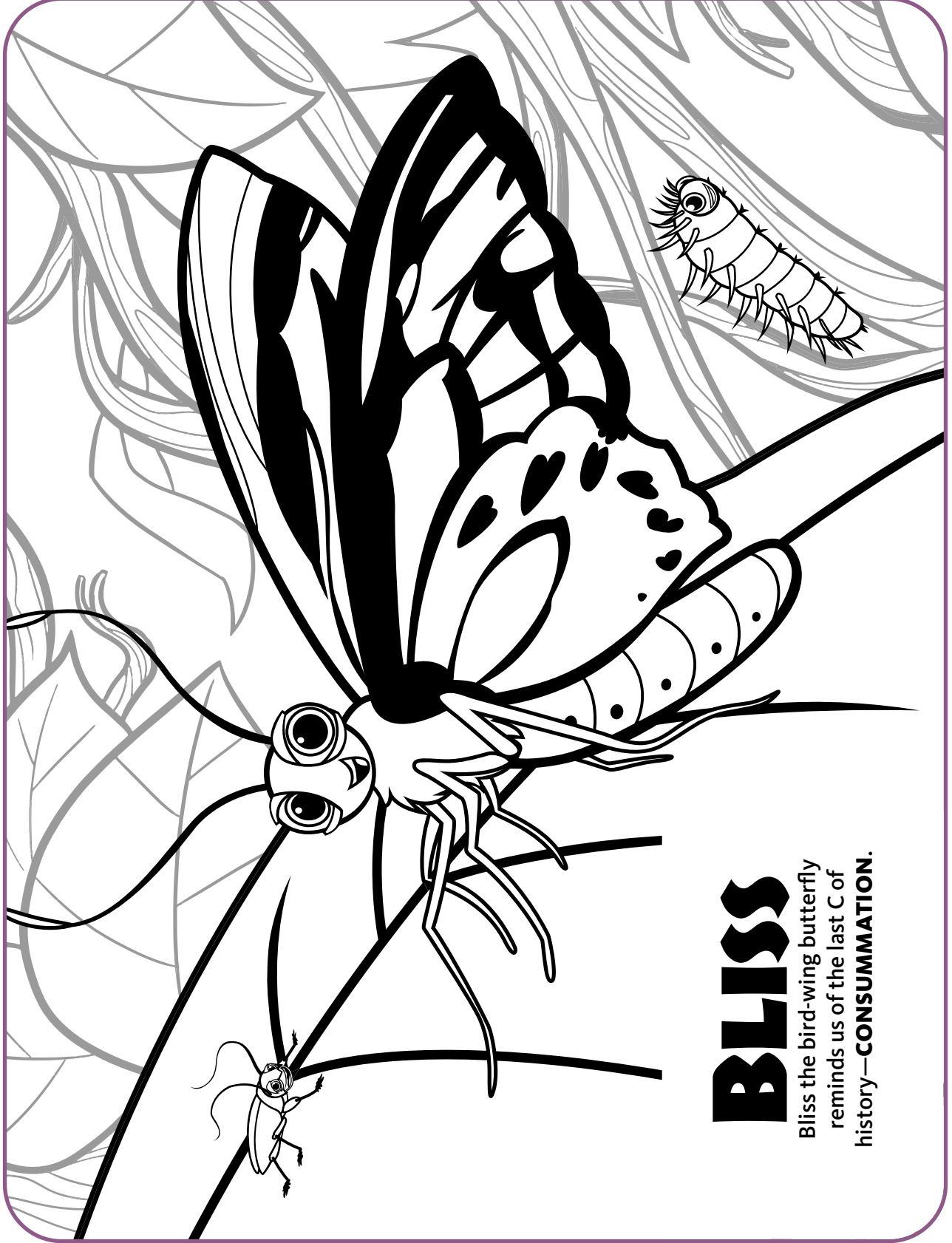
Ask yourself these questions:
