Q. How does God show his love for people?



A. We need to believe in Jesus and what he did for us on the cross and repent of our sins to God.





A. We should worship only God. We can tell about how great he is and sing praises to him.




A. We can talk about how great he is, what he has done for us, and what he has done for other people.

God is sovereign (rules over everything; is in control of everything). Genesis 1; Job 12:13–25, 37:2–13; Psalm 22:28, 115:3; Isaiah 40:21–26; Daniel 2:21, 4:35; 1 Timothy 6:15

God is love. Psalm 37:28, 100:5; Proverbs 3:12; Matthew 5:44–45; Ephesians 1:4–5; 1 John 4

God is merciful (doesn't give us what we deserve). Deuteronomy 4:31; Psalm 51, 103:8; Romans 5:8; Ephesians 2:4

God is gracious (gives us what we don't deserve). 1 Peter 5:10

God is a Trinity. Matthew 3:16–17, 28:19–20

God is just (acts fairly and punishes sin). Genesis 18:25; Deuteronomy 32:4; Psalm 9:7–8, 19:7–9, 51:4; Acts 17:31; James 4:12
