




Day 1—PRE-PRIMARY

Destination: Creation



Destination: Old Testament Locations

Welcome back, Time Travelers! We hope you had an awesome time at *Time Lab* today, traveling to Old Testament times. Our animal pal, Lottie the Lamb, reminds us of the shepherd Moses, who had a one-of-a-kind experience. The Angel of the Lord (Jesus) appeared to Moses as a bush that was on fire but didn't burn up (Exodus 3). The Son of God (Jesus) appeared to Moses to give him a big job: freeing the Hebrew people from Pharaoh. God promised that he would be with Moses and that Pharaoh would let the people go. It happened just the way God said it would because he is a promise keeper. God always, always, always keeps his promises!


Tomorrow's Verse:

Day 3-PRE-PRIMARY

Destination: Visitation

Hello, Time Travelers! Today our animal pal, Sergeant the St. Bernard, reminded us that just like he seeks and saves the lost, Jesus seeks and saves those who are spiritually lost. God sent his son, Jesus, to earth as a tiny baby to save us, just like he promised.

In the beginning, Adam and Eve sinned (disobeyed God's command). Since that time, every person has been born a sinner. We all disobey God's commands. The punishment for sin is death, and when we die, we are separated from God in a terrible place. The good news is that God sent his Son because he loves the world and wanted to save us from our sin. In his great love, perfect Jesus chose to take the punishment for our sin as he died on the cross. He rose from the dead on the third day! Through Jesus, God provided a way for us to have fellowship with him again. He offers us eternal life with him in heaven. When we repent of our sin (say we are sorry and turn from it) and believe in Jesus, we can receive the gift of eternal life with God forever.

Jesus *always has been, always will be* ready to love and forgive those who truly want to become his children!


Tomorrow's Verse:

Day 4—PRE-PRIMARY


Destination: Preparation

Our animal pal, Bucky the Beaver, gives us a clue about what Jesus has been doing since he left earth and returned to heaven. Bucky is preparing his home, and Jesus is preparing a place in heaven. The Bible tells us Jesus is in heaven getting a place ready for all those who are his children (John 14:2–3). We don't know exactly what it's going to look like, but we know it's going to be the most amazing, wonderful place ever. Jesus is praying for us, too! When you pray to Jesus, he shares your prayer with God the Father (Romans 8:34). Jesus is always caring for his children and praying for them!



Destination: Celebration


Hello, Travelers! We hope you had an incredible time at *Time Lab* this week.
