Destination: Creation

Hello, Time Travelers! We hope you had a blast today at *Time Lab* where you started exploring the truth about Jesus from eternity past to eternity future. You learned that Jesus always has been and always will be! Jesus has always been; he doesn't have a beginning. Jesus was right there at the beginning of creation. In the creation account, God uses the words "us" and "our." God created so many different things, and all three persons of the Trinity—God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit—were doing the creating!

We also learned that Jesus knows about everything and cares about everything—the big stuff like stars and planets and the small stuff like our animal pal, Flutter the Sparrow. He created *you*, loves *you*, and cares for *you* very much. The Creator of the universe, who has been around forever, cares about *you*!

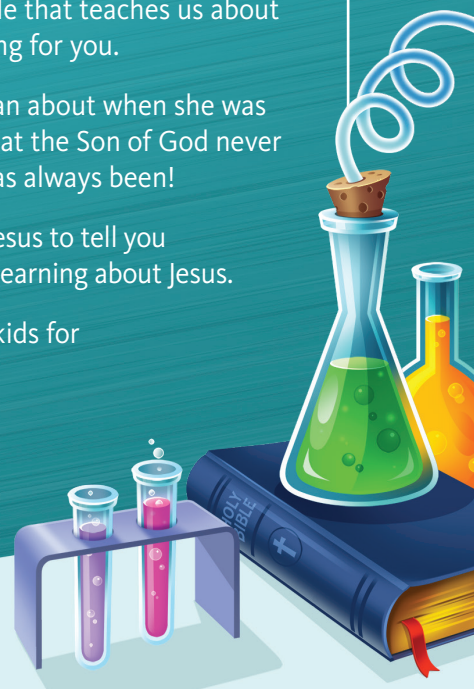

Destination: Old Testament Locations

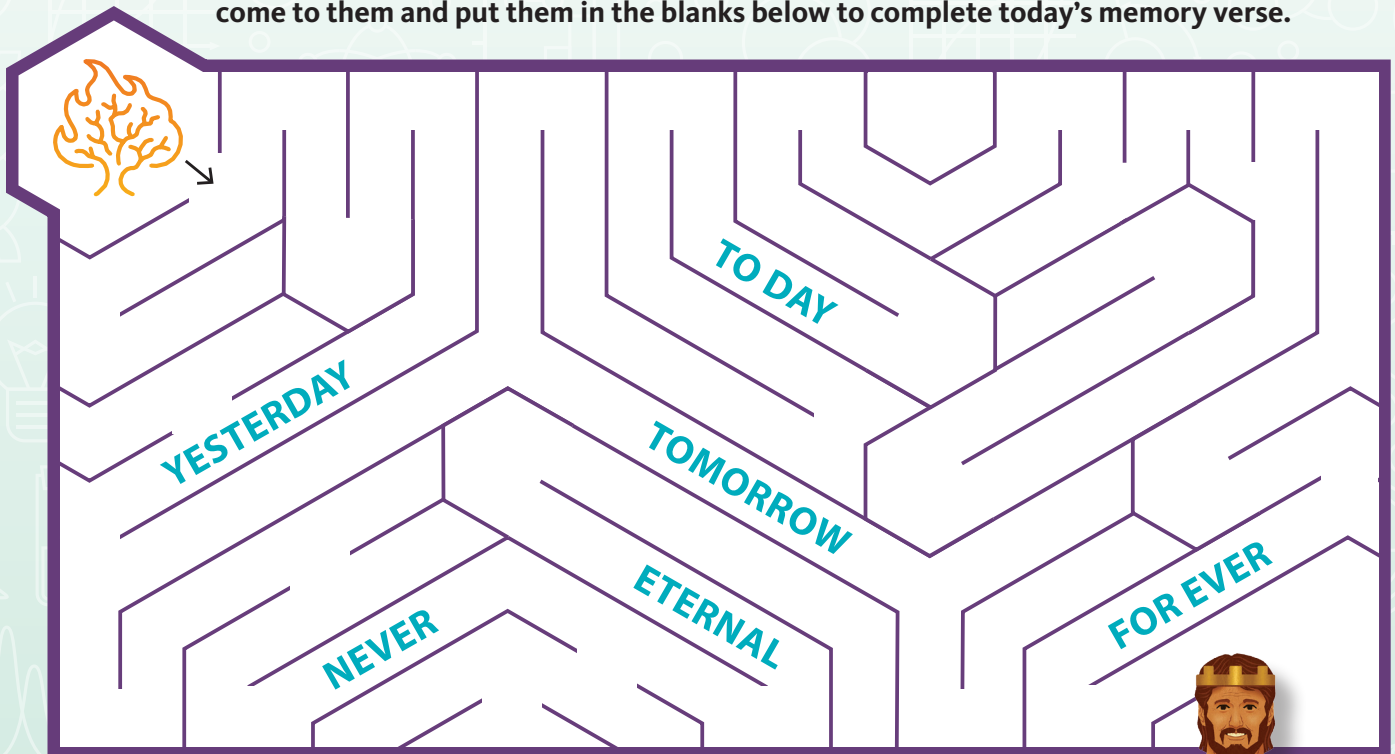
Welcome back, Time Travelers! We hope you had an awesome time at *Time Lab* today, traveling to Old Testament locations searching for Son of God sightings. Our animal pal, Lottie the Lamb, reminds us of Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world—just as God promised in the Old Testament.

In our first Old Testament Son of God sighting, we met Abraham (Genesis 18), who was sitting by a tree when the Lord appeared to him. The Son of God promised Abraham that when he returned to visit a year later, Abraham and his wife Sarah would have a son. It happened just as the Lord had said! Next, we fast-forwarded to a man named Moses. The Angel of the Lord (the Son of God) appeared to Moses in the form of a burning bush and gave him a big job to do (Exodus 3). In both cases, things worked out just the way God said they would because he is a promise keeper!

Jesus *always has been, always will be* a promise keeper—from Old Testament times to forever!

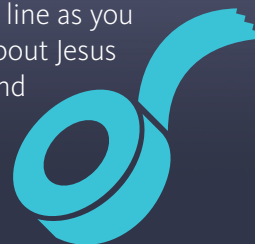

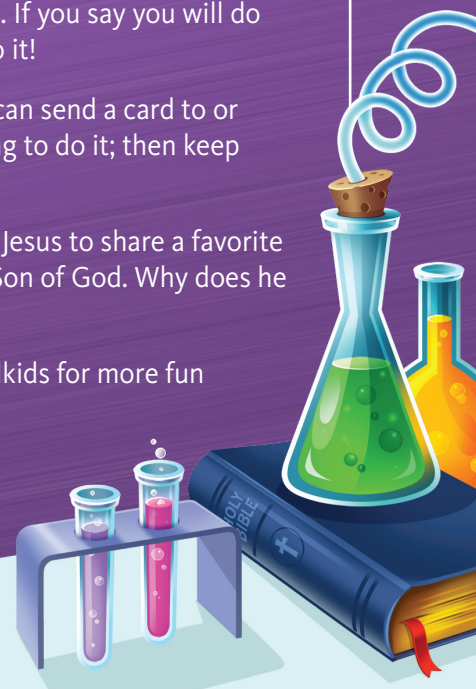
Tomorrow's Verse:

Destination: Visitation








Hello, Time Travelers! Today our animal pal, Sergeant the St. Bernard, reminded us that just like he seeks and saves the lost, Jesus seeks and saves those who are spiritually lost. God sent his son, Jesus, to earth as a tiny baby to save us, just as he promised.

In the beginning, Adam and Eve sinned (disobeyed God's command). Since that time, every person has been born a sinner. We all disobey God's commands. The punishment for sin is death, and when we die, we are separated from God in a terrible place. The good news is that God sent his Son because he loves the world and wanted to save us from our sin. In his great love, perfect Jesus chose to take the punishment for our sin as he died on the cross. He rose from the dead on the third day! Through Jesus, God provided a way for us to have fellowship with him again. He offers us eternal life with him in heaven. When we repent of our sin (say we are sorry and turn from it) and believe in Jesus, we can receive the gift of eternal life with Jesus forever!

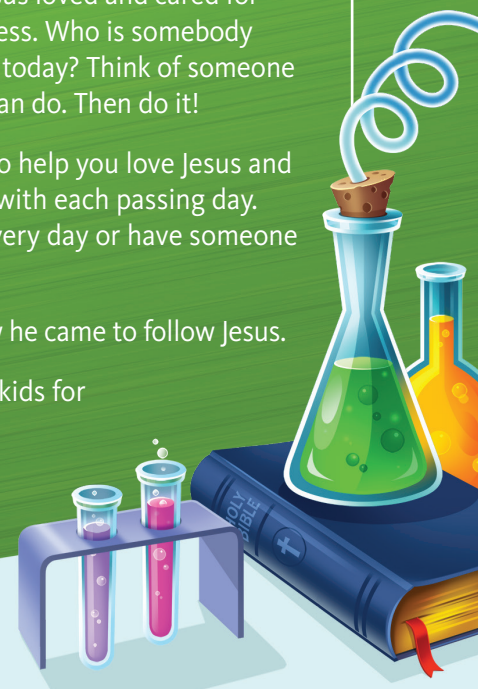

Destination: Preparation

Hi again, Travelers! We left off yesterday with Jesus coming back to life. Our animal pal, Bucky the Beaver, gives us a clue of what Jesus has been doing since he left earth and returned to heaven. Bucky is preparing his home, while Jesus is preparing a place for his children and is building and caring for his church. Jesus is currently in heaven building that place—an actual place (John 14:2–3).

When Jesus was on earth, the bridges the Romans built served as go-betweens. Jesus is currently in heaven acting as our go-between, or Intercessor (Romans 8:34). There is a gap between us and God, but Jesus, who became sin for us and who has given us his righteousness, bridges that gap for Christians (those who have received the gift of eternal life). When a child of God prays to God, Jesus brings that request to God the Father. Jesus is also in heaven protecting and caring for the church—not the church building but the people all over the world throughout time who have repented of their sins and believed in Jesus (Matthew 16:18). The church (God's people) may go through hard times because of the cursed, sinful world now, but the church will *never* be destroyed because Jesus is protecting and caring for it.

Jesus *always has been, always will be* caring for his children—even now from heaven.

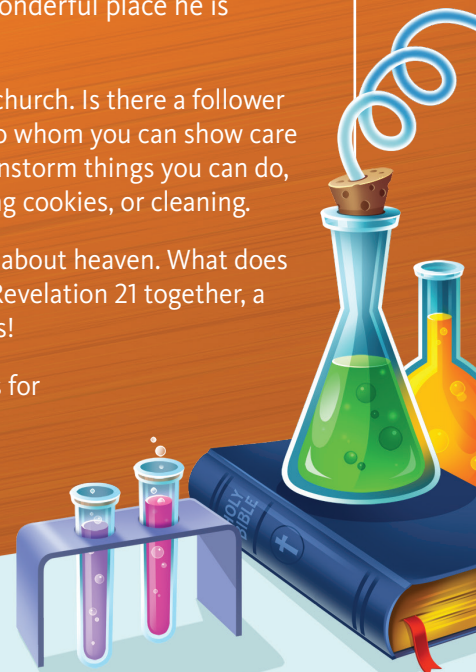
Tomorrow's Verse:

Hello, Travelers! We hope you had an incredible time at *Time Lab* this week! Today, our animal pal, King the Lion, reminds us of Jesus the Lion of Judah, the King of kings. As we learned yesterday, Jesus has been busy preparing a place—a new heaven and a new earth (2 Peter 3:13). Heaven is a real place, where every child of God gets to live forever with Jesus. The Apostle Paul, in 1 Corinthians 2:9, tells us that we cannot begin to imagine the amazing place Jesus is preparing. The Bible tells us many things about the new heaven and new earth. No sin and no sickness will be there, and the streets will be made of gold while the gates will be made of pearls. In the future, as we explore the new earth, enjoy its beauty, and have fun playing, we will be happy knowing that Jesus is our Lord and friend even as he sits on the throne.
