Read John 1.



WEEK 1 • DAY 1

Q. Is Jesus God?

John 1:1, 10:30-33



*A. Yes! These verses (and others) teach that Jesus Christ is God.*

Q. Is Jesus a man?

WEEK 1 • DAY 2


Galatians 4:4; Philippians 2:5–8



*A. Yes! These verses (and others) teach that he was born of a woman and took on a human body.*

Q. Who did Jesus claim to be?

John 6:48, 8:12, 10:7-10, 10:11-14, 11:25, 14:6, 15:1, 15:5



A. These are called "I AM" statements of Jesus: I AM the Bread of Life; the Light of the World; the Door; the Good Shepherd; the Resurrection and the Life; the Way, the Truth, and the Life; the True Vine.

**Q.** Is Jesus the Creator  
of everything?

WEEK 1 • DAY 4

**Genesis 1:1; Colossians 1:15–17**



*A. Yes!*

WEEK 1 • DAY 5

Q. Is Jesus the Savior  
of the world?

2 Timothy 1:10; Titus 2:13; 2 Peter 1:11



A. Yes!

Read Genesis 1.



Q. How and what  
did Jesus create?

## Genesis 1



*A. He created the heavens and the earth in six days by speaking!*

Q. Can Jesus heal sick people?

WEEK 2 • DAY 2

Matthew 4:23–25; Luke 4:38–40



*A. Yes! The creator of life has power over sickness!*

WEEK 2 • DAY 3

Q. Can Jesus change the weather?

Matthew 14:22–32; Luke 8:22–24



*A. Yes! The creator of the sky and seas can calm storms! He also walked on the water!*

Q. Can Jesus forgive sins?

WEEK 2 • DAY 4

Luke 5:18–25



*A. Yes!*

WEEK 2 • DAY 5

Q. Can Jesus raise  
the dead to life?

Luke 7:11–17; 1 Corinthians 15:54–57



*A. Yes! He has power over death!*

# What did Jesus teach?

Read Matthew 5.



**Matthew 5:43–44; Mark 12:28–31**



*A. We should love God and all mankind—including our enemies!*



Q. Whom should I help?

WEEK 3 • DAY 2

Matthew 6:2-4



*A. I should help those who need it.*

WEEK 3 • DAY 3

Q. Does God care for us?

Matthew 6:25–34



*A. Yes! We should not worry because God is in control of all things.*

Q. How should I treat others?

WEEK 3 • DAY 4

**Matthew 7:12**



*A. I should treat others as I want to be treated.*

Q. What did Jesus teach Nicodemus?

John 3:1–17

A. He taught how we can escape God's judgment because of our sins and instead have eternal life.

# **Why did Jesus come to earth?**

Read Matthew 1.



Q. What does Jesus' name mean?

**Matthew 1:21**



*A. Savior. He will save his people from their sins.*

**Q.** For whom did  
Jesus come to earth?

WEEK 4 • DAY 2

**Mark 2:17**



*A. Sinners.*

2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Peter 2:21–22; 1 John 3:5



*A. No. He always obeyed God and his commands.*



Q. Did Jesus always obey  
the Law of Moses?

WEEK 4 • DAY 4

**Matthew 5:17–18**



*A. Yes. He came to obey and fulfill the Law of Moses.*

WEEK 4 • DAY 5

Q. Did Jesus come to serve or to be served?

Matthew 20:20–28



*A. He came to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.*

WEEK 5

# Why did Jesus die?

Read Genesis 3.



Q. What is the condition of all people?

**Genesis 3; Romans 3:23, 5:12**



*A. From the time of Adam, all people have sinned. We all disobey God's commands. The punishment for sin is death.*

Q. What is required for  
sins to be forgiven?

WEEK 5 • DAY 2

Hebrews 9:22



*A. God requires that blood be shed to pay for sins.*

WEEK 5 • DAY 3

Q. Why did Jesus die on the cross?

Romans 5:6–11; 1 Corinthians 5:7; Colossians 1:15–20



*A. He died and shed his blood to pay the penalty for our sins.*

Q. Did Jesus stay dead?

WEEK 5 • DAY 4

Matthew 28:1–10



*A. No—he rose from the dead physically and is alive today!*

WEEK 5 • DAY 5

Q. What gift does God offer us?

Romans 6:23, 10:9–10; John 17:1–5; 1 John 5:1–13



*A. Eternal life. We receive this gift by repenting of our sins and believing that Jesus died and rose on our behalf.*



WEEK 6

# Is Jesus alive?

Read Matthew 28.



Mark 16:1-8



Q. Who saw Jesus after  
he rose from the dead?

WEEK 6 • DAY 2

1 Corinthians 15:1-7



A. He appeared to the apostles, to over 500 other people, to his  
brother James, and to Paul (and to many others as well).

Q. Why is it important that Jesus rose from the dead?

Romans 6:1-14




A. His resurrection showed that he is the Son of God, that death had no power over him, and that He can give eternal life to those who believe in Him.

**Q.** What does Jesus promise for the future?

WEEK 6 • DAY 4

**John 14:1-4**



*A. He is preparing a place for us and will come again and receive us unto himself so that we can be with him in heaven forever.*

Q. What should we do while we wait for Jesus' return?

**Matthew 28:19–20**



*A. Tell others about what Jesus has done so they can have eternal life also.*

WEEK 7

# **What prophecies did Jesus fulfill?**

Read Isaiah 52:13–53:12.



WEEK 7 • DAY 1

Q. To whom was Jesus born?

Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:20-23



A. The prophecy in Isaiah was given about 700 years before Jesus came. He was born of a virgin.



Q. Where was Jesus born?

WEEK 7 • DAY 2

Micah 5:2; Matthew 2:1




A. Micah gave this prophecy about 700 years before Jesus came. He was born in Bethlehem.

WEEK 7 • DAY 3

Q. Where was Jesus called out of?


Hosea 11:1; Matthew 2:14–15



A. Hosea gave this prophecy about 725 years before Jesus came. He was called out of Egypt.

Q. Would any of his bones be broken?

Psalm 34:20; John 19:33–36



A. The psalmist prophesied 1,000 years before Jesus came that none of his bones would be broken. And none were, although during a crucifixion, the guards commonly broke the leg bones of those on the cross to make them die more quickly.

WEEK 7 • DAY 5

Q. Would Jesus rise from the dead?

Isaiah 53:8, 11; Matthew 28:1–9



*A. Isaiah prophesied about 700 years before Jesus came that he would “see” again (or rise from the dead)—and he did!*
