The baby is recognizable as a little boy or a little girl. The umbilical cord is easy to see.



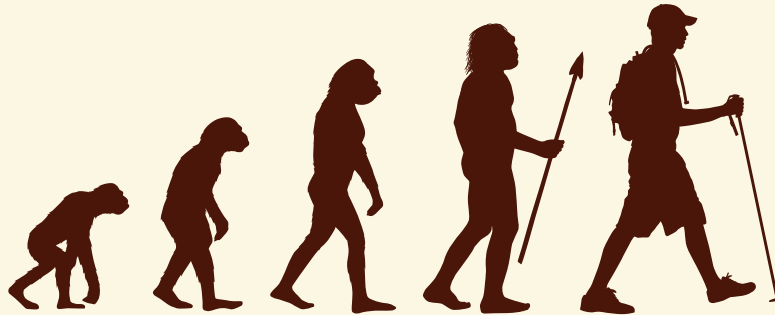
WEEK 37-41

Day 1: The Beginning of Life

Made in God's Image

G'day, mates! Today was an aus-some day in the Australian outback, exploring the creation account from Genesis. You learned about some of the amazing things found in Australia like the dingo, Uluru, and Jumpin' Jack, today's animal pal. Jumpin' Jack hopped by to remind us that we are created special by a special Creator. We didn't evolve from ape-like creatures.

As we explored the creation account in Genesis 1–2, we learned that God created everything in our universe from nothing. (Only God can do that!) God made Adam (the first person) from the dust of the ground. God breathed life into him, and he became a living person—fully formed and working perfectly! Out of all of God's amazing creations, only humans are made in God's image.

People don't share an ancestor with ape-like creatures. So-called "missing links" like Lucy, Ramapithecus, and Neanderthals are either fully human (Neanderthals) or fully ape (Lucy and Ramapithecus). Sometimes those "missing links" are completely made up! No true ape-men fossils have ever been found, and they never will be. God made people in his image, and God made apes differently from people!

The Creator created you special! You didn't evolve from an ape-like creature!

GO AND DO

- » Look up Isaiah 64:8 and Psalm 100:3. Who made you? Get some play dough and form it into something. You are the creator of that item, but you can't bring it to life, can you? How is God's creation of you so much greater than your play dough creation?
- » Pray and tell God what an amazing Creator he is and why you're thankful you're specially made in his image. Remember: God doesn't make any mistakes! He does all things well—including making you!
- » Sadly, many Aboriginal people were treated poorly because other people thought they were better than them. Can you think of anyone you know who is looked down on and treated poorly for some reason? What can you do to encourage that person?
- » With your parent or guardian, brainstorm things animals can't do that people can do. For inspiration, you may want to observe your pet, animals at a zoo, or animals online. Remember—you don't come from an animal!

You are fearfully and wonderfully made with a body full of awe-inspiring design features.



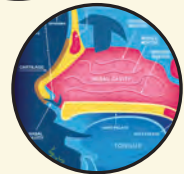

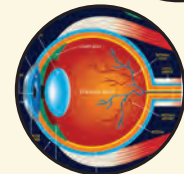

G'day, blokes and sheilas! (Do you remember what those fun Aussie words mean? Guys and girls!) As you traveled to the Australian coast today, you met Bill the platypus. He is a unique creature, and every person in the world is unique and valued by God, too!

In your Bible lesson, you learned about Jesus' birth. Every baby is special, but Jesus was the most special baby ever! Not everyone was excited about his birth, though. When he realized that Jesus was special, King Herod wanted to kill Jesus. He wanted to be the only special person around. God values all people. But sometimes people, like King Herod, don't treat others well. King Herod couldn't find out where Jesus was, so he had all of the boys two years or younger in Bethlehem killed. (Jesus wasn't there, though—he was in Egypt.) Herod didn't have the right view of life. But God considers every life valuable, and we should too!

- » Think of someone who needs special care, such as a person in a nursing home or a hospital or who uses a wheelchair. It could be a pregnant mom, a newborn baby, or a single mom who cares for her family by herself. Talk to your parent or guardian about ways you can get to know them, and find out how you can help.
- » Talk to God and ask him to help you know how to help others. Use Luke 6:31 to guide your prayer.

Day 4: Eternal Life Made for Relationship

G'day again, mates! In the eucalypt forest today, you learned all about koalas, like our animal pal Paula. God gave koalas a parent who takes good care of them. But no parent takes better care of their children than God. You can become a child of God through faith in his Son, Jesus. The Bible tells us what a person must do to become part of God's family and, someday, live in heaven.



We all sin (Romans 3:23)—this means we disobey God's commands. God wants us to always be truthful, but none of us are. The punishment for our sin is death (Romans 6:23). Because we sin, we cannot go to be with God in heaven when we die. God is holy and cannot allow sin in his presence. He is also just, which means he must punish sin. But because God loves us so much, he sent Jesus to rescue us from sin so we can go to heaven to be with God.

God sent his Son, Jesus, to earth as a baby boy. Jesus lived a perfect life as a man, and then he made the greatest sacrifice ever by giving up his life to die on the cross in place of sinners. He was buried and sealed in a tomb. But because he's God, he didn't stay dead. Jesus rose from the dead! Now Jesus offers every person the gift of eternal life in heaven.

You can become part of God's family by repenting of your sin and believing that Jesus is God and that he took the punishment for your sin. As part of God's family, you can look forward to living in heaven with Jesus forever!

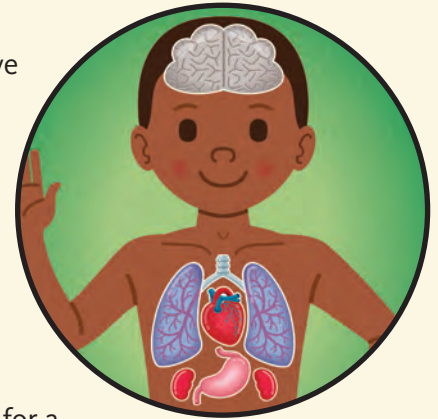


Day 5: Using Your Life Made for a Reason
